Small Group Questions for the week of 11/19/17

- 1. As we come to the close of our series on spiritual gifts what is something you have learned? Additionally, what question(s) do you still have about spiritual gifts?
- 2. Nathan talked about ownership and how personal ownership changes when we follow Jesus. In a very real sense, God owns us and we belong to Jesus. Read Romans 8:9.
- Explain the "if" clause in the first half of Romans 8:9 in your own words. If what, then what?
- Read 1 Corinthians 6:19–20. How does that help you understand what it means to belong to Jesus?
- Why might Paul shift from "the Spirit of God" to "the Spirit of Christ" within the same verse?
- 3. In this series we have discussed the following gifts: prophecy, service, giving, mercy, teaching, leadership, exhortation, discernment, knowledge, wisdom, faith, healing, miracles, tongues, interpretation, administration, and hospitality.
- Which of these gifts do you think you may have?
 Now that you have a better idea of how spiritual gifts work and what gifts you may have, what needs in the church/community do you see that can be met with your gifts? Where can you "just do it?"
- 4. "Spiritual gifts work best when we are trusting God and our leaders." In what ways do you find it difficult to trust authority? Does knowing how spiritual gifts work help to trust authority? In what ways?
- 5. "Spiritual gifts work best when we are thankful to God for our gifts and the gifts of others." How does being thankful affect the way you use your gift at BCC?
- 6. Read Romans 12:3 and Ephesians 4:1-3. Why is humility mentioned in the context of spiritual gifts?
- 7. Take a few moments to pray and thank God for your gifts and the gifts of others in the church. Since your group has been together for 10 weeks, you may consider thanking God specifically for the gifts of people in your group.
