The Pastor's Point By Dr. Jimmy Orr

Recently, I came upon the obituary of Mr. E. Paul Warren. I never knew Mr. Warren, although I did know his wife, Mrs. Lorraine. They were members of Palmetto Baptist Church years ago. Mr. Paul Warren died in 1999, before I became pastor. He was 80 years old. He had been a businessman, the owner of Warren's Auto Parts. A World War II Army veteran, he served with the Corps of Engineers in Europe.

What caught my attention about Mr. Paul's obituary was the list of honorary pallbearers: "Honorary pallbearers will be members of Mr. Warren's Sunday School class at Palmetto Baptist Church: Jack Bentley, Clyde Taylor, Homer Youngblood, Charlie Pace and Lynn Ware."

While I never knew Mr. Warren, I did know his honorary pallbearers.

Mr. Jack Bentley, "Smilin' Jack," gave me some old golf clubs and tried his best to teach me to play golf. I never caught on, but I enjoyed being on the course with Jack. Jack's wife, Audrey, was in the hospital at Warm Springs when Merriell Jenkins and I drove to visit with her. Merriell said he knew a shortcut—a shortcut that took us across the Alabama state line. What should have been a 45 minute journey took us over two hours.

Mr. Homer Youngblood and his wife, Mrs. Martha, were fixtures at PBC when I came. Before my time, the church discussed purchasing a new copier. Mr. Homer was against it; but when the church voted to buy one, Mr. Homer came by with a check the next day to pay for it.

Charlie Pace headed up our Senior Adult Ministry and cooked our Wednesday Night Suppers. I'll never forget the senior trip to Pigeon Forge when Charlie secretly had me brought on stage at the Comedy Barn. I love Charlie and Hilda.

Mr. Lynn Ware and his wife Betsy lived in a small brick house in Palmetto, down the street from Palmetto Elementary School. Mr. Lynn, another World II veteran, didn't say much, but that was mostly because Betsy would not let him get a word in edgewise.

And then there is Mr. Clyde Taylor, the last survivor among Mr. Paul Warren's honorary pallbearers. When Mr. Clyde died last month, he was 101 years old, and our oldest church member. His wife, Mrs. Etta, had died in 2011 after battling years of Alzheimer's. Mr. Clyde was a Marine, a comedian, a cracker and potato chip salesman, and a great man rolled into one. Mr. Clyde was laid to rest beside Mrs. Etta at the Georgia National Cemetery in Canton.

Yes, sir! Mr. Paul Warren had some great honorary pallbearers.
