Pastor's Point

July is my favorite month. I am a July guy! When I was young, my family took an annual July trip to Panama City Beach, Florida. We played Goofy Golf, ate at Captain Anderson's Restaurant, and spent hours upon hours at the Miracle Strip Amusement Park, where we rode the Starliner Rollercoaster, got sick on the Scrambler, got soaked in the log jamboree, drove the antique cars, and took numerous tours of the haunted house. More than anything, I loved our time on the beach enjoying the ocean. Even as a child, it seemed that God spoke through the ocean. I felt close to Him just by being near the ocean. So many things about the ocean remind me of God.

You are convinced that the request is godly and holy. You are convinced that it is God's will to meet your request. Yet, God does not always give you what you ask, no matter how godly your request may seem. So, in this way, God can be unpredictable.

There will always be more of God that we do not know than what we do know about Him. There is more about the ocean that we do not know than what we do know. Only 5% of the ocean's floor has been mapped in detail. What is true about the ocean is also true of God. There will always be more about God that we don't know than what we know.

God is both predictable and unpredictable. The ocean is both predictable and unpredictable. No matter when we go to the beach, the ocean waves will always be pounding the shore. The ocean is predictably consistent in this way. Likewise, God is predictably consistent. God will always do what is right. God will forever love us no matter who we are or what we have done. But the ocean is also unpredictable. There are waves called rogue waves that can pop up unannounced in the middle of the ocean for no visible reason. Some rogue waves rise up as tall as a ten story building. Oceanographers and marine biologists are stumped as to what causes these unpredictable waves. In the same way, sometimes God's actions are impossible to predict. You have a certain need, you pray for God to work in a certain way in the midst of your need.

The deeper we go in our relationship with Jesus, the more powerful He becomes to us. The deepest known area of the Earth's oceans is known as the Mariana Trench in the western Pacific Ocean. Mariana Trench is roughly 7 miles deep. The water pressure at that depth is the equivalent of having 50 jumbo jets piled on top of you. The deeper one goes into the ocean, the more powerful the ocean pressure becomes. The same is also true of God. The deeper you go in your relationship with God, the more powerful God becomes. My prayer this summer is that we all will grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus!
