Decision for Jesus

When is a good time to help your child make a decision for Jesus?

Look to do this whenever the child wants to! Whether they are 5, 10, 15 or 45, it really doesn't matter. The key is that they are ready and that they WANT to make a decision for Jesus. This should involve them recognizing sin in their lives and the need for forgiveness.

Why should someone make a decision to follow Jesus and be saved from their sin?

We are all sinners in need of a Savior. (Rom. 3:23). Jesus came to pay our penalty on the cross (Rom. 3:24). He lived a perfect life, was crucified, dead, buried and resurrected from the grave. By declaring Jesus as your Lord and Savior you are saved, made new and forgiven of your sins eternally (Jn. 11:25; 1 John 5:11-13).

Who can you ask for assistance if you need help?

Any of the Pastors would love to help you or your child start a relationship with Jesus. Just ask any of them and they would love to talk!

Ideas:

- Need a visual illustration? Be sure to grab the packet explaining how our sin separates us from God. We need to have faith in Jesus' life, death and resurrection to be restored into a right relationship with God.
- Make a certificate that shares:
Name, Date of decision for Jesus, Parent/Guardian signature. Back side "Special thoughts from my salvation decision day..."
- Invite Family and Friends over for a celebration dessert after the decision for Jesus is made. (Telling the child about it after they make the decision not before!)
- Reading the book of John to understand the gospel.
- Reading the book of Romans to understand our need for a savior.
