

Small Group Discussion Guide

Passage: Exodus 19:1–25

Theme: God's Gracious Covenant Calls for Our Total Consecration

Opening Reflection

Think of a time when you prepared for something important — a wedding, an exam, a special guest, or a big event. How did your preparation reflect how important that moment was to you?

1. Observation – What Does the Text Say?

- Where does this story take place, and how long has Israel been on their journey?
- What does God remind the people of in verses 4–6?
- What instructions does God give Moses for the people before He appears on Mount Sinai?
- What physical signs accompany God's presence on the mountain?

2. Interpretation – What Does It Mean?

- What does God mean when He says, "You will be my treasured possession... a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (v. 5–6)?
- How do God's grace (v. 4, "I carried you on eagles' wings") and God's call to obedience (v. 5, "If you obey...") work together?
- Why does God require the people to consecrate themselves before approaching His presence?
- What does this passage teach us about God's holiness and the seriousness of His covenant relationship?

3. Discussion – How Does This Speak to Us Today?

- Why is it important to remember what God has already done for us before responding in obedience?
- What does "total consecration" look like in modern life — in our habits, relationships, or priorities?
- How can God's grace motivate obedience rather than legalism?
- In what ways do we, as believers, serve as a "kingdom of priests" in the world today?

4. Application – How Should We Respond?

- What area of your life might need to be "set apart" for God this week?
- How can you practice preparing your heart to meet with God — in worship, prayer, or community?
- What are practical ways your small group can encourage one another toward holiness and devotion?

Closing Prayer Prompt

Lord, You have carried us by Your grace and called us to be Yours. Set us apart for You. Teach us to approach You with reverence, obedience, and joy.
