COURAGE TO CHANGE

Those who missed our guest speaker, Noelle Hunter Phd., Dean of Student Life at Ohio Valley University, missed her phenomenal true life story of God's mercy, grace and saving power against all odds. Noelle grew up in a single parent home where marijuana was the everyday normal lifestyle. She had faith in God as a child, but did not realize her lifestyle was not in line with God's life of joy for her. She attended Ohio University and found the same drug culture that was familiar to her. She married and had a child, then divorced and lost custody. She attended West Virginia University where again she found the same drug culture. She got her Phd., moved to Chicago, and later married a Muslim she had met while at WVU. They moved to Morehead, Kentucky where she worked at Morehead State University. She had another daughter. While driving with her 4 month old daughter in the car, Noelle was high on drugs. She was arrested and her daughter was taken to the hospital where her 4 month old tested positive for cocaine. Noelle went to rehab in Kentucky. She and her husband divorced, but had joint custody. Her ex-husband did not return their daughter after a visit, but kidnapped her to his home country in Africa. Noelle spent several years and a lot of hard work, but with the help of God and several government officials from both countries, was able to bring her daughter back safely to the United States. Noelle is a great witness of God's love, saving grace, mercy and power. She credits God for the amazing way she was able to return her daughter to her home in the U.S. Of the thousands of children that are abducted to other countries only 10% are returned. Noelle has organized the I Stand organization to bring abducted children back to the U.S
