**COURAGE TO CHANGE**

Courage to Change had a surprise Thursday June 21. We were blessed with 3 speakers from the Recovery Point in Parkersburg. Justin our scheduled guest speaker brought Adam and Travis with him. Each man told his story of addiction, recovery and hope. Justin told how he grew up in a church with a religious family, but still turned to alcohol and drugs to fill the void in his life. After going to 16 rehabilitation programs and treatment centers he realized only God could fill the void. He came to the Recovery Point in Parkersburg, went to the Warehouse Church, was baptized and now attends there and volunteers in the community. He is due to be released from parole in a week. Adam had a similar story of growing up in a religious family in Cabell County WV, but got involved with Meth and other drugs. He overdosed 4 times and was pronounced dead for 15-20 minutes. He was in ICU in St. Mary's hospital. He was discharged from the military for drug use, but now is in the Recovery Point program. He too recognizes God is the answer. Travis is one of the supervisors at the Recovery Point. He has been through the program in Huntington and is now working with the program in Parkersburg. Recovery Point is a non-profit facility supported by grant money. There is no charge for the program. Recovery Point in Parkersburg is associated with several other recovery facilities in other states like South Carolina and Tennessee. The clients are accepted by phone or court order. It is a very structured program from detox to rehabilitation. They are involved in many community projects saying "we took from the community (literally money), now we want to pay back."

**LOVE IN ACTION**

We received the final amount that was donated by our church family to the Women's Care Center during the baby bottle campaign. We donated \$ 1150.00. Thank you to all who gave for this very worthy cause! Jeff gave another excellent sermon Sunday on Stewardship. We hope it has challenged all of us to reach out more to those around us in relationships this week. A preacher from Dallas spoke on the Sermon on the Mount and the healing of the leper. The underlying premise was to encourage Christians to run TOWARDS the messes in our lives. We usually try to avoid the ugly, uncomfortable, messy parts of life or people. Running towards the mess gives us the opportunity to extend true love to marginalized people...people who may, like the leper, go most of their lives not feeling the love of another human being. As we grow as stewards, may we each get "dirty" as we climb into the messes of ours and others lives.
