COURAGE TO CHANGE

Thursday August 16, the Courage to Change meeting lesson was about Acceptance. We discussed how to determine the difference between what is our responsibility to others and what is not. We had listed on the board 8 signs of a Toxic Person: 1. They spread negativity, 2. They criticize you and others, 3. They are jealous, 4. They keep disappointing you, 5. Everything is always dramatic, 6. They play the victim, 7. They are self-centered, and 8. They aren't interested in changing. Each of those in attendance could relate having someone that had some or all of these traits, either a friend, a family member or a "Christian" brother or sister. We had to determine how to love that person, without getting caught up in the drama and understand that it is not our responsibility to "change" them and it is okay to distance ourselves from them. You can look at and love a cactus, but you don't have to hug it. Only God can change their heart. Love is not always a warm and fuzzy emotion. 1 Corinthians 13 gives the biblical formula for love.
