Greetings Greene Street UMC!

It has been great to get to know you a bit over the past few weeks. My family and I would like to thank everyone for the warm and hospitable greeting we have received. We are looking forward to the season ahead!

It is hard to believe that the season of Lent is upon us. Folks interact with Lent in different ways. It has become customary for many to give something up for Lent. This of course reflects an attempt to fast from something in order to honor God. If you're really zoned in, then you would be fasting from something in order to draw closer to God. For instance, if you wanted to give up watching TV for Lent, you could take that time that you would normally be watching TV and spend it in prayer, or study, or some kind of worshipful attitude. For many of us, we give something up with good intentions, probably fail at what we want to give up, and then feel guilty because we didn't do what we thought we should. This is a similar kind of thing that happens every New Year when we convince ourselves that we are going to get healthy, eat better or become more disciplined in some area of our lives. But Lent can be something else. It can be personal renewal.

Joan Chittister in her book The Liturgical Way says that, "Lent is a call to renew a commitment grown dull, perhaps, by a life more marked by routine than by reflection. After a lifetime of mundane regularity or unconsidered adherence to the trappings of faith, Lent requires me, as a Christian, to stop for a while, to reflect again on what is going on in me. I am challenged again to decide whether I, myself, do truly believe that Jesus is the Christ - and if I believe, whether I will live accordingly when I can no longer hear the song of angels in my life and the star of Bethlehem has grown dim for me."

So Lent can be a time of going through the motions, we can give something up if we want, but if it doesn't lead to a deeper engagement with our faith in Jesus, then I think we miss the point. Lent can be a time of renewal and a time to say again, Jesus, I believe.

I hope you'll join us for worship throughout Lent as we contemplate and think about what it means to follow Jesus!

As St. Paul says in Philippians 4:17, the true beauty in giving isn't the gift itself, but that "more be credited to your account." I firmly believe acts of love such as this will be repaid hundredfold in Heaven.

I am a junior at The Ohio State University. I recently changed majors from Mechanical Engineering to Philosophy, being convinced that the Lord is calling me in a direction to work directly with others, particularly in my faith. I am very involved with St. Paul's Outreach here on campus, a Catholic Missionary Community. Leading Bible Studies, staffing retreats, giving talks, and evangelizing college students who are looking for more has brought the greatest joy in my life. I look to continue this in the future, in whatever calling I discern. I am also a Combat Engineer in the US Army National Guard.

This summer, I will be going to Calcutta, India for a few weeks with a religious order called The Brotherhood of Hope.
