FROM THE PASTOR

The Holiest of Weeks

Every year, as the midwestern spring seems to tarry, we long for the flowery, bright triumph of Easter joy. We glimpse it in the joyful waving of palms and revel in the brass and lilies of Easter. After a long, somber Lent, coupled with a long transition out of winter, we're ready.

Yet, in our rush to welcome Easter joy, we must always be careful not to miss the hard and holy stuff that makes it possible—namely, *Holy Week*.

Holy Week is the 8-day stretch from Palm Sunday (4/9) through Easter Sunday (4/16). And while the two Sundays are, indeed, glorious and joyful celebrations, it's what comes between that really makes the spirit shiver.



Holy (Maundy) Thursday (4/13): We remember "the night in which Jesus was betrayed." We remember how, even on that night, he knelt and washed the feet of *all* the disciples (even the one who would deny him; even the one who would betray him) as an act of love and service - and so, we wash each other's feet

as well. We remember how he gave himself in order to forgive – and so we hear the most intimate words of forgiveness we hear all year. We remember how he gave us a Meal to remember him by - and so we share that Meal with renewed gratitude. We remember how under the cover of darkness, our Lord was humiliated and sent to his death – and so we strip the altar, a sign of the shame we share with Jesus.

Good Friday (4/14): Jesus hangs on a cross. There is nothing to celebrate. No Meal, no praise, no joy. We remember our betrayal as we hear the noisy coins of Judas on our way to the cross. Yet, we call this night "Good."



Because in the darkness of this night, we meet a God who swam through the ocean of sorrow to rescue all who drown in sin, grief, and death. We adore the cross, for on this cross was hung the Salvation of the Whole World.

Easter Vigil (4/15): In the darkness of the cross and empty tomb, we gather to light a New Fire. We light candles. We tell stories (crazy, dark, beautiful, fun, weird stories). We celebrate Baptism - for on This Night Jesus was buried and arose, and in These Waters we are buried and raised up. We ring bells, light lights, sing praises, share the Meal, and party like it's the end - and beginning - of the world as we know it. Because it is.

Join us for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday – please! These are awesome days, and we're planning some great stuff to make them memorable and



meaningful. But *please* don't skip the days in between. It is in the in between where Jesus does the hard and holy work. It is in the in between where we need a God who is with us. It is in the in between where we meet the Savior of the World. Peace.

Night Before Easter Cookies

1 cup pecans, whole	Bible	Pinch of salt
Wooden spoon	1 teaspoon vinegar	1 cup sugar
Ziploc baggie	3 egg whites	Таре

Preheat oven to 300 degrees (this is important; don't wait until you're half done with recipe.) Place pecans in Ziploc baggie and let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. *Read John 19:1*.

Let each child smell vinegar; put vinegar in mixing bowl. Explain when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30. Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. *Read John 10:10-11*. Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers and the bitterness of our own sins. *Read Luke 23:27*. So far, the ingredients are not very appetizing.

Add 1 cup sugar; explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. *Read Psalms 34:8 and John 3:16.* Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those sins that have been cleansed by Jesus. *Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.* Fold in broken nuts; drop by teaspoonfuls onto waxed paper-covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body laid. *Read Matthew 27:57-60.* Put the cookie sheet in the oven; close the door and turn the oven off. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. *Read Matthew 27:65-66.* **Go to bed!** Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight; Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. *Read John 16:20 and 22.*

On Easter morning, open the oven and given everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. *Read Matthew 28:1-9.*

What should you fill the bag with?? A good rule of thumb for donating is: if you'd serve it, they want it. The food pantry handles all types of foods, but here is a shortlist of items they look for the most:

Canned fruit or vegetables; Canned meat (stews, tuna, chicken, ham, Spam)

Cereal, pasta, boxed meals such as mac & cheese Peanut butter and jelly

Soup (cream soups and chunky soups)

For Special Diet Needs:

Low-sodium soups; no- or low-sugar items Soy or rice milk; powdered drink mixes Fruit packed in water or its own juice

Infant and Toddler Needs:

Formula (regular and soy), especially *Good Start* formula Stage 2 and 3 baby food Diapers and wipes Baby powder and diaper rash cream

Treasurer's Comments:

I've added some additional information you will be seeing each month. Please let me know if you find it beneficial.

February's income was less than our expenses. Coupled with January's income/expense, we are tracking year to date as anticipated. All bills are paid, including all capital projects.

We again were able to pay our mortgage one month early as we have been for the past two years, saving us interest and allowing more to be put towards the principal. The mortgage comes due for readjustment 5/19. I'm looking at all options and will be providing information on our direction in the near future.

At the Annual Meeting several financial concerns were expressed. Additional concerns were raised in separate small meetings and emails. The concerns focused on the accuracy and validity of the financial information presented and the opportunity for inappropriate activity by the financial team. I believe these concerns are due to not knowing the financial process at CTS with its checks and balances. My responsibility as treasurer is to ensure everyone at CTS has confidence in our financial process, the financial information we provide and the financial team. I assure you our financial process is top rate and the financial team is of the highest integrity. If you'd like to learn more about the process, please contact the office and they can give you a detailed copy of the financial process.

We are conducting an internal audit on 4/22 by the team assembled by Mike Pirlott; we will conduct an outside audit by the accounting firm of Scrima and Kabitzke on 5/15. Please contact me if you have any questions or comments
