What are you thinking?

It's 3 am and you are jolted awake by the thought that you didn't pay the overdue electric bill. That thought is followed by a long list of things you need to do today. There's that meeting, the thing at the kid's school, and you



haven't called your Mom in weeks! Pretty soon, everything goes off the rails and you are worried about the library book you forgot to return 20 years ago. Try to stop thinking and just sleep, but it's no use. Does this sound like you? Do things happen and you can't stop thinking about them? Actually, we are all thinking - all of the time. A study I read about last year said that humans have on average 6000 thoughts every day. So, what are you thinking?

As followers of Jesus, we sometimes think that thinking and faith are two separate things. I believe that thinking and faith are inseparable. Faith involves our thinking and our thinking flows from our Faith. God's Word has much to say about who we should think because we have Faith in Christ. Look at Ephesians 4:22-23: "put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds,." Or Philippians 2:5: "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus."

In Philippians 4:8 we are given a list of what we should dwell on or give our full attention to: "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." Are these the things that we we are thinking about and dwelling upon every day? Or, do we let the cares and worries of this world take over and drag us down.

Given that so many people are struggling with anxiety and depression, it's time to adopt Paul's battle approach in the fight for our minds. This is Paul's game plan in 2 Corinthians 10:5: "We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ."

So when destructive or tempting thoughts pop into our minds, we take down any thought that would lead us away from Jesus. The truth is that God is always with us as we struggle and do battle with our thoughts. As we spend time with God in His Word, we are filling our hearts and minds with His truth: We are saved and we are free! Be sure to check out our "Peace of Mind" sermon series this month as we look to God for the peace of mind we all need.

EASTER JOY

"But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus." Luke 24:1-2



Why were the women going to the tomb that morning? Were they going to greet their resurrected Lord? Did they want to be the first ones to welcome Him back from the dead? Nope. "You seek Jesus, the Crucified One. He's not here. He's risen just like He told you." The angel's words leave no doubt: those ladies were actually going out to that tomb in grief-stricken unbelief. This may seem harsh, but it's true. Christ told them multiple times over the course of three years exactly what He was going to do on the third day after dying, and yet they still went out to the tomb. They were believers, but their grief and worry had gotten the better of them. They had failed to remember and trust in the words and promises of the Savior. Their whole world had come crashing down less than 72 hours earlier. Can we blame them for acting this way. Would we act any differently? He sends His angel to them, to lovingly correct them. To re-focus them on the joy that is already theirs in Christ.

What has the same resurrected Lord said to you? It's easy to get focused on the wrong things, especially when things seem dark and our morale runs low and our faith gets beat up. Times like the last year when we have been separated from our families and our church families. Our focus, our joy today is not on the empty tomb and where He isn't, but more importantly where he is, crucified and risen from the dead. What

has our risen and victorious Lord already told us? "This is my Body, This is my Blood. As often as you do this remember what I have said; remember what I have told you." Here is the Lord of Life, right where he promises to be, telling you right where to seek Him and receive Him. He doesn't practice "social distancing" from you. He draws near to you. Here is the resurrected Christ, for us, for the forgiveness of our sins.

God's word is still speaking to us this very day, just like it did with the women at the tomb, pointing us to the living and risen Christ, who has promised us that he is present with His word, His Body and His Blood. We're being pointed to where the living and victorious Christ is so that we may share with Him in the joy of the resurrection victory: His resurrection victory...our resurrection victory.

He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

President Report

THE NEW NORMAL?

I was thinking things will eventually get back to normal. When? I am guessing September. That guess is based on various plans for schools, anticipated levels of vaccinations, rippling infection rates, and related social distancing rule changes. So, September may be it, if Pennsylvania does not go sideways in the meantime.

What does that change means in the meantime?

Easter will not have the pancake breakfast for a youth fundraiser. However, we will continue the practice of not having Sunday School on Easter. Instead, we will have three services at 8:30, 9:45, and 11:00. The 8:30 and 9:45 services will be traditional; and the 11:00 will be contemporary. If you feel up to coming, you should. We will still have online registration to help us balance seating; but *it is not mandatory*. We seat every third pew and keep six feet between households like this chart shows. This example gets 60 people into a service. It depends on group sizes, etc.

We are continuing to suspend First Friday night gatherings. But you should expect to see some outdoor recreation events during the summer.

Come and See

On His way to Galilee, Jesus called Philip to be one of His 12 disciples. After receiving Jesus' call, Philip, pleased to be a disciple, told his friend, Nathanael, that he had found Jesus of Nazareth, the person whom Moses and all the prophets had foretold in the Old Testament. Nathaniel responded, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46). Philip responded, "Come and see." Jesus calls us to be like Philip and to say to our families, co-workers, neighbors, friends, and all people, "Come and see." As God's people, we have been given a wonderful privilege and a responsibility to be the hands, feet, and mouth for Jesus. We are His instruments through whom He works so others can hear the Good News of the Gospel.

In our conversations, we could use the words "come and see" in many different ways. When we acquire new furniture, a dress, or a car, we may say, "Come and see." How much more important it is that we ask others to "come and see" Jesus as He has revealed Himself to us in His Word. We have the opportunity to introduce people to Jesus Who has given the world the greatest miracle that has ever occurred. Jesus, the Son of Man, condescended to come to earth to live as one of us, to be humiliated and die for the sake of those He loves, and then to rise victoriously, the "firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20). This miracle is one to be shouted from the housetops, for it is meant for all humankind. Christ has died for our sins and risen again so that we might live forever with Him. We are called to go and invite people to "come and see" Who Jesus is and what He has done for us. We invite people, and the Holy Spirit does the rest.

So why are we often hesitant to invite people to "come and see" Jesus? Do we fear we'll be rejected? That we won't have the answers to questions we're asked? That we'll look foolish? All these things may happen but that's God's business. Not everybody is going to want what we have to offer, but many do. Our task is to invite, "Come and see." If we love God, we will love His people (1 John 4:20), and, if we love people, we will be compelled to witness. Our love will overcome our discomfort. Our compassion will overcome our inhibitions.

We should all be encouraged to pray that the Holy Spirit will make us aware of the opportunities He lays before us, the people He places in our lives—people we know and sometimes complete strangers. As Philip invited his friend, let us invite all who will listen, "Come and see." The investment of our time and effort will be an investment that pays eternal dividends.

Prayer: O Lord, You graciously look on me, not as I deserve, but through Jesus' eyes of love and forgiveness. You guard me through this life and keep me safe for eternity. Give me a readiness to speak of the sacrifice of Your Holy Son Who gave His life for me and all who believe. Through Christ Who calls me to be a steward for Him. Amen.

Volunteers Background Checks

Starting July 1, 2015 in Pennsylvania, volunteers 18 years and older who worked with children were required to have a background check which consisted of a Child Abuse Clearance, a Criminal History Check and an Affidavit if living in Pennsylvania for the past 10 years (if not, then a FBI fingerprint check is required).



Most of our church volunteers obtained their clearances in 2015. Now that it is 2021, most of these clearances have expired. **Now is a good time to renew your clearances.**

The Book of Luke (CPH Study Guide/video) Leader: Ron Niesen

Extension of the study of the Gospel of Luke through the spring term (11-Apr to 27-Jun, 12 weeks)



Per Dr. Arthur Just (Concordia Theological Seminary): "Luke wrote his Gospel to provide a trustworthy historical record of Jesus Christ. From the start Luke's account is catechetical: it teaches the facts of Jesus ministry for the purpose of instilling saving faith and strengthening the knowledge and appreciation of how Christ continues to redeem sinners through the ministry of Word and Sacrament." Compiled from both oral and written accounts, Luke points to God's gracious salvation through His Son, Jesus Christ. The peace that Christ has brought to the world enables us to break out in a liturgy of praise. The salvation story did not end with Christ's ascension, however; Christ's Church is called to go to "all nations"-men, women, children, the poor, the sick, and the disenfranchised-proclaiming the victory found only in Jesus Christ. Luke speaks to us about:

- God's plan for bringing salvation to both Jew and Gentile; ٠
- believers' unceasing joy upon hearing the Good News;
- the work of the Holy Spirit in Jesus' life and in our own;
- the enduring value and importance of prayer. ٠
