A Word as We Begin

Dear Church Family,

On **February 18**, we begin the season of **Lent** with **Ash Wednesday**, marking the start of a sacred journey that leads us toward Easter.

According to *The United Methodist Book of Worship*, Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The word *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, meaning *spring*. It is a season of preparation, renewal, and reflection as we ready our hearts for the celebration of Christ's resurrection.

Historically, Lent began as a time of fasting and preparation for baptism and later became a season of repentance and spiritual growth for all Christians.

We invite you to a meaningful Ash Wednesday service as we enter the season of Lent together.

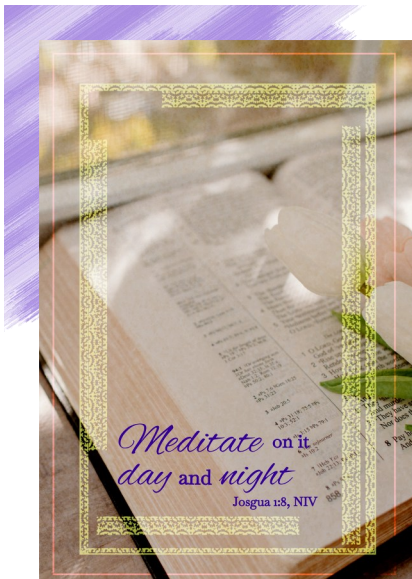
Ogallala – 5:00 pm

A Lenten Practice to Consider

Choose one small way to make space for God this season.

- ◊ A few minutes of prayer
- ◊ A daily Scripture reading
- ◊ Worship each week



What Is Lent?

During Lent, we are invited to reflect deeply on our faith and examine the things that either draw us closer to God or pull us away.

Some people choose to fast from something that distracts them. Others choose to take on a spiritual practice that helps them grow. For example:

- ◊ Fasting from social media and using that time for prayer
- ◊ Spending more time reading Scripture
- ◊ Committing to regular weekly worship
- ◊ Joining a Bible study or small group

Lent is not about perfection. It is about intention.

A Lenten Focus: Growing in God's Word

This Lent, I want to encourage our congregation to grow in **biblical literacy** and to spend more intentional time in the Bible.

The Bible is one of our primary sources for understanding God and our faith. If we do not read it, it becomes difficult to truly know either.

If you do not own a Bible, the church would be happy to provide one to you **free of charge**. We have Bibles available on the shelf next to the nursery. Please feel free to take one.

Lenten Invitations to Carry Beyond the Season

I invite you to consider these practices during Lent and, hopefully, continue them throughout the year:

- ◊ Carry your Bible with you, especially to worship on Sundays
- ◊ Spend time each day reading Scripture, even if only a few minutes
- ◊ Join a Bible study or gather a small group of friends to read and discuss Scripture together

These practices may seem simple, but many people share that they struggle to find time or do not know where to begin. Carrying your Bible with you often reveals unexpected moments throughout the day when you can open its pages. The more you read, the more familiar and meaningful it becomes.

Where Do I Start Reading?

For those who are new to reading the Bible, getting started can feel intimidating. The simplest approach is just to begin.

I recommend starting in the **New Testament**, reading one or two chapters a day.

Each week, we also provide daily readings from the **Revised Common Lectionary** printed in the bulletin. These can be taken home and placed inside your Bible as a helpful guide.

In addition, I offer a daily podcast based on these readings, including the Scripture and a short reflection.

Learning Together: Lenten Book Study

Reading Scripture on your own is important, but engaging in conversation with others is just as valuable.

This Lent, I will be leading a book study beginning **February 24:**

- ◇ **9:00 am in Ogallala**
- ◇ **6:30 pm in Big Springs**

We will be studying *Why Did Jesus Have to Die?* by **Adam Hamilton**.

If you are unable to attend this study, I encourage you to form your own group of two or more people. You might:

- ◇ Read a chapter a day in the Gospel of Matthew
- ◇ Meet weekly to discuss what you've read
- ◇ Use *The Upper Room* devotional for group discussion

At the back of The Upper Room booklets, available near the front door of the church, you will find helpful weekly discussion questions. If you would like help starting a group, please reach out to me.

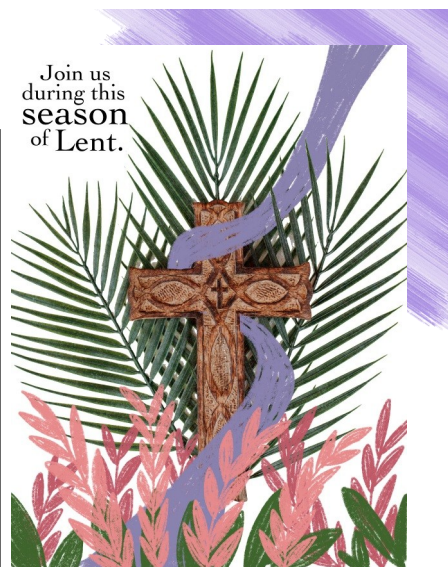
A Closing Prayer

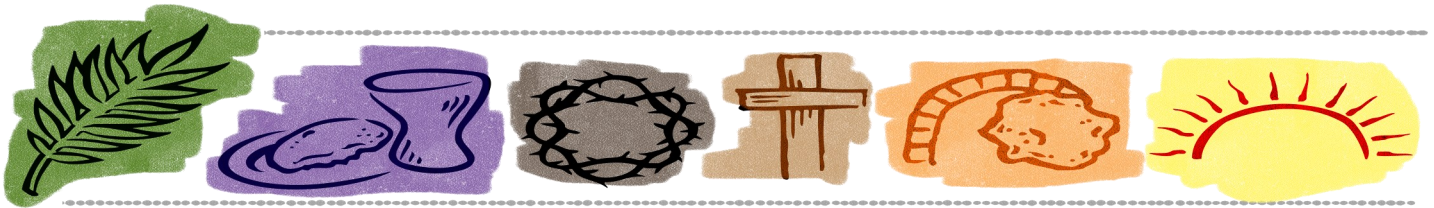
