Call to Worship (Psalm 50)

Confession of Sin and Plea for Pardon (Luke 16, Psalm 17)

God of Abraham, we know that what is exalted among men is an abomination in Your sight. **Yet we seek to justify ourselves before men through our good works, our wealth, and our status. We often ignore Your Word, which calls us again and again to faith in the gospel, and instead we seek to earn our own acquittal in the court of public opinion. We hoard the good things we receive from Your hand and use them to comfort ourselves in this world. We believe the lie that our true inheritance is to be**

found in this age. We are too easily satisfied with leisure, money, health, and even family. Call us to faith in Your Word, O God. Wondrously show your steadfast love, O Savior. Grant us refuge from our own sin at Your right hand, and give us faith to believe that all You have provided for us is enough.

Worshippers may continue to confess their sins in silence.

Beloved, for Jesus' sake, your sins are forgiven. You shall behold the face of the LORD in righteousness. **We shall be satisfied with His likeness. We are God's children now, and when Christ appears, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.**
