Each year, to mark the season of Advent, our church gathers for midweek worship and reflection on the coming of our Lord. Due to the prevalence of COVID-19 in our community presently, we will not gather in-person for Christmas Vespers in 2020. However, we encourage you to use this liturgy at home—families, home groups, and individuals—in order to mark the season and reflect on both the first and second comings of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

We have included songs, readings, and prayers which draw on Scripture and other resources from our rich Reformed tradition, including the Westminster Standards (confessional standards of the PCA), the Book of Common Prayer (liturgical standard for the Anglican Church in North America and the Church of England at the time of the Reformation), and more. #### CONFESSION OF SIN AND PLEA FOR PARDON

MATTHEW 23

(Read aloud together and then spend some time in silent confession)

Revealer of truth and of Your will for our obedience, we have transgressed Your law in thought, word, and deed. We act hypocritically, doing our deeds to be seen by others and loving the honor and glory we receive from them. We are careful to feign external obedience, but we neglect the weightier matters of the law: justice, righteousness, and truth. We are quick to judge others, yet slow to examine ourselves. Forgive us, Lord, and let your Word shine on the darkness in our hearts, that we may walk in the light of repentance and faith.

Worshippers may continue to confess their sins in silence.

#### ASSURANCE OF PARDON

MATTHEW 5, 2 CORINTHIANS 8

(Have one person start, then all join in bold)

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs in the kingdom of heaven. We know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for our sake He became poor, so that we by His poverty might become rich.

#### **PRAYERS FOR PEACE**

The Bible teaches that as our Prophet, Jesus reveals to us God's will for our salvation by His Word and Spirit (see WSC 24 above).

Spend some time this week praying for the Word of God to take root in your hearts and in the hearts of our church, and for boldness to share God's Word with others.
