We aren't sure when this was written or by whom, and interpreting this book is always an interesting challenge. I have placed it here because I think the book speaks symbolically of the Jews' desire for their homeland, their tradition and culture, their first love.

But it also speaks in symbolic language about the bond between Christ and his Church. And because of that it can be counted as prophecy too as the time of the coming Messiah draws close. When you follow the prophets of this era, you will get the sense of growing expectation of more of what the Lord will do.

The King is coming!
