CRAIG AND REE COULBOURNE

Craig and Ree Coulbourne have been missionaries in Japan with MTW since 1994. After working with a Japanese pastor to plant Kaihin Makuhari Grace Church (1996-2008), the Coulbournes were sent by that church to plant Shin Urayasu Grace Church as a daughter church. Craig was the church-planting pastor at SUGC from 2012 to 2025. Craig and Ree were involved in outreach and discipleship through church-based and community activities. In April 2022, Craig was named MTW Japan Director. In this role he oversees the leaders of MTW's 9 teams in Japan and cooperates with leaders from the Presbyterian Church in Japan. MTW Japan and the PCJ are working together to see the Church of Jesus flourish in Japan. Craig and Ree are currently in Maryland on home assignment through May of this year.



CHARLES BIGGS

The Rev. Charles R. Biggs, Th.M., is the Regional Home Missionary (RHM) for the OPC's Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic (PMA). Ordained in the OPC in 2001, he was church planter and founding pastor of Ketocin Covenant Presbyterian Church in Purcellville, VA, where he served for over 18 years. Rev. Biggs graduated from Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, PA and Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary in Grand Rapids, MI. Since his ordination, he has served as teacher at 1st Baltimore OPC, chaplain and teacher at Chapelgate Christian School, and pastor at KCPC until 2021, before taking on his current position. Charles has been married to Margaret Ann for over 34 years and they have two daughters, Elisabeth Grace and Esther Hope, whom they have adopted from China and Ethiopia. The family travels regularly with Charles as he serves as RHM and are affectionately known as "Biggs Team RHM"!



TOM HOMANS

Tom Homans has been the director of the Baltimore Christian Community Center for over 30 years. The Christian Community Center is a non-profit ministry located in the Union Square neighborhood of West Baltimore. The mission's focus is to disciple and serve children and their families in the local neighborhood. The center operates on weekdays from 2:30 pm to 5:00 pm, serving children in grades K-12. The center provides snacks, activities, Bible teaching and music to the children after school each day, as well as an annual summer camp, and a recently added homeschool co-op. Tom and his wife Cindy have three adult daughters, all of whom participate in the ministry at the center.
