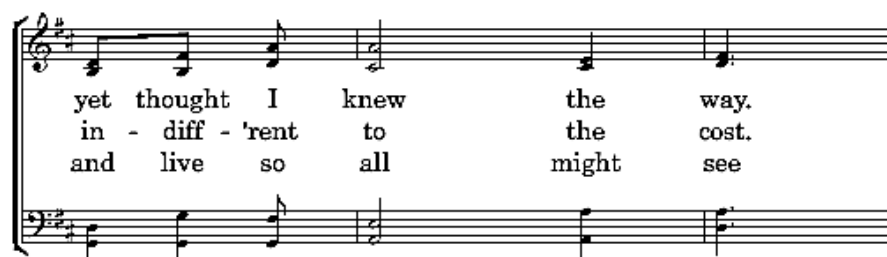

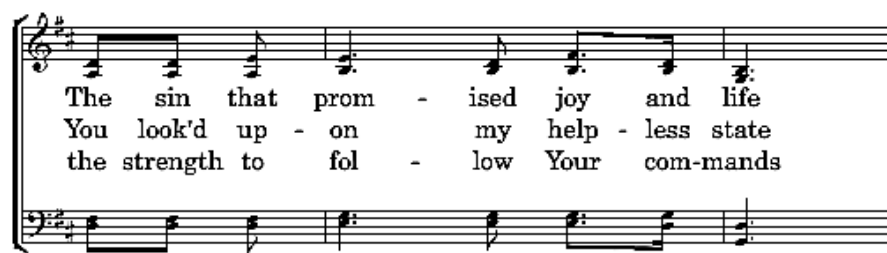

(chapter XII – Of Adoption)
