✓ **New Testament Survey: General Letters and Revelation**

This is an introductory level class through the last group of books in the New Testament. This will include Hebrews, the Letters of Peter and John, Jude and the book of Revelation. The New Testament is at the heart of our understanding of the Old Testament but also of our own times as well.

This class begins September 14.

✓ **What It Means to be Protestant**

Using Gavin Ortlund's *What It Means to Be Protestant* (2024) as a guiding text, this course will identify important topics in contemporary Protestant apologetics with the aim of proposing both a positive case for Protestantism and a rebuttal of popular talking points from other Christian traditions like Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy. We will discuss how to defend concepts like sola Scriptura and justification by faith alone when talking to non-Protestants, while critiquing Romanist theories about the papacy, infallible church authority, doctrinal development, baptismal regeneration, and more. After exploring the principles underlying these different traditions and assessing various historical claims, the course will conclude with two case studies in which we deconstruct prominent "infallible" teachings in the Catholic/Orthodox traditions: The Assumption of Mary and icon veneration.

Walking to Age 3: Bible Stories and First Catechism. Babies with parents welcome.

Kindergarten: God Created All Things

Grades 1-2: Obeying God

Explore the lives of prophets and kings from the Old Testament and learn what it means to obey God.

Grades 3-5: Genesis

Creation, the Fall, the flood, the Abrahamic covenant, the patriarchs, and Joseph.

Grades 6-8: Studying (and reading through) the Gospels. Middle school students should read half a chapter a day, five days a week in preparation to study through God's word to the New Testament church. See the reading schedule in each week's bulletin.

Grades 9-12: Wisdom Literature & Hosea

We will read through and discuss the Wisdom Literature of the Bible. Daily assigned readings from Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon, and Hosea will facilitate Bible study on Sunday mornings.
