

Victories from 2025

- * **WE BAPTIZED 10 PEOPLE INTO CHRIST IN 2025!**
- * We began the year with *21 Days with God* in January which set a healthy tone for the year. We had people continue to meet throughout the year as prayer partners.
- * We sent a group to Nationwide Youth Roundup for work week in June and we sent 42 people to the conference in July.
- * We provided scholarships to 3 students attending Ozark Christian College to prepare for Christian ministry.
- * We increased the part-time ministry internship with Nic Babbs.
- * We took 7 high school students to a Tuesday Tour at Ozark Christian College in Joplin, MO.
- * Nic Babbs, Walker Brosi and Benjamin Small, three college students from BCC, preached at different times throughout the year.
- * We sent 18 people to ICOM/SICOM in Atlanta, GA.
- * We sent 8 students to LSCA retreats last winter and 27 students to LSCA camp this past summer.
- * We financially and prayerfully supported our mission partners: Asia Pacific International, Inner City Mission, Lake Springfield Christian Assembly, Mathetes Youth Ministry in the Philippines, Ozark Christian College & Lincoln Seminary, and Pioneer Bible Translators. 10.9% of our offerings and tithes were given to missions.
- * Multiple teen discipleship groups met throughout the year.
- * We sent a group of men to the Iron Sharpens Iron Men’s Equipping Conference in Springfield, IL.
- * Our Women’s ministry hosted a Women’s Tea & Testimonies at which 4 women (2 mother/daughter pairs) from 4 different generations spoke. The women’s ministry also hosted a Fall Bonfire at the Patterson Farm.
- * We partnered with FCA in New Berlin and Pawnee High Schools. 20+ students attended most Fridays at each school.
- * We partnered with Loami CC again this year for VBS and averaged 50 students and 50 volunteers each night at “Lava Lava Luau” VBS. Vacation Bible School raised a total of \$1835.83 for the Mathetes Youth Ministry and both BCC and Loami CC matched that amount to send a gift of \$5507.49 to our friends in the Philippines.
- * We replaced the video projector in the sanctuary and purchased a storage container for ministry equipment.

“This Church Feels Like Family”
A Conversation with Seth and Megan Weber

I had the opportunity to sit down and visit with Seth and Megan Weber to hear their story. Seth and Megan Weber are active members in our church and have three children Ryder, Harper, and Deanna Weber. Seth and Megan both grew up in the Springfield area, and they met each other through work. They now live in the Pleasant Plains area.

When I asked Seth and Megan if they grew up in the church, Seth mentioned he had pleasant experiences at a Presbyterian church growing up. After he met Megan, they had been back to that church a few times, but it didn't feel like the same church Seth had grown up in. Megan shared how she would go to church sometimes with her grandparents on Easter and Christmas.

I remember going to the Weber's house with Warren to go through our Deeper Life 101 class with them. I asked both Seth and Megan how that experience was for them. Both shared positive experiences with that curriculum. Seth and Megan agreed that the Deeper Life 101 class made them more ready for baptism and Seth mentioned that he “enjoyed learning about the past, present, and future of the church. It helps us understand what this church stands for.”

Seth and Megan were immersed into Christ on September 7, 2025. I asked them both to share about their baptism experience. Seth and Megan talked about how it was a new journey for their life and how it was the push they needed to become closer to Christ. After their baptism, Seth attended our 3 Colors of Your Gifts class in which he identified that his spiritual gifts include craftsmanship, counseling, and faith. He also reflects the character of Peter, in which he is heavy in commitment. Seth mentioned that he felt these results were very accurate, and it helped him have a new view of his faith.

Seth described Berlin Christian Church as being “loving” and “family-like”. Megan loves Berlin Christian Church because it makes her feel like she is a part of something. She also said, “People actually talk to you.” They both agreed that Berlin Christian Church is very welcoming and feels like family.

As we partner to make more and better followers of Jesus Christ, Seth and Megan are walking testimonies of what our mission looks like. Thanks to the Weber family for letting me share their story. Thank you for investing in the gospel.
