

## **Life Group Questions for Psalm 8**

### **1. When was the last time you slowed down and truly stood in awe of God's majesty?**

Scripture: Psalm 8:1 "Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!"

Life Application: Build intentional moments into your week to pause, look up, and praise God for His creation and character. Even 30 seconds of focused awe can reframe your day.

### **2. Do you see your worship as an act of spiritual warfare?**

Scripture: Psalm 8:2; 1 Corinthians 1:27

Life Application: Begin each day with praise, even before you check your phone or start your to-do list. Praise shifts your focus and silences the enemy's lies.

### **3. How does remembering God's majesty impact the way you approach problems?**

Scripture: Colossians 1:16 "All things have been created through him and for him."

Life Application: When you face challenges, remind yourself the One who created the universe is the same God holding your life steady.

### **4. Do you believe your voice in worship matters to God?**

Scripture: Matthew 21:16 "From the lips of children and infants you, Lord, have called forth your praise."

Life Application: Sing, pray, or speak words of worship daily, even if you feel small or unqualified, God uses your praise to push back darkness.

### **5. How does it change your perspective to know God is mindful of you personally?**

Scripture: Psalm 8:4; Hebrews 2:9

Life Application: Rest in the truth that God's care for you is not generic, it is personal, intentional, and proven through the sacrifice of Jesus.

### **6. In what ways are you living out the purpose and dignity God has given you?**

Scripture: Psalm 8:5–6; Genesis 1:26–28

Life Application: Use your God-given influence, at home, work, and in the community, to reflect His character and steward His creation.

### **7. Does your life declare the majesty of God's name?**

Scripture: Revelation 4:11

Life Application: Let your daily actions, how you speak, work, and treat others, point people to the greatness and worthiness of God.
