Food insecurity in York County

Blue Valley Community Action has seen a sharp rise in need for food in York County. Henderson Ministerial Pastors (Bethesda, FEBC and Living Hope) met together with Lisa Epp who works for Blue Valley out of York. She offered pastors resources and shared about some of the most effective ways to provide support to anyone who may struggle with food needs. If you would like to help, consider these following ways of getting involved:

- Help the Henderson Ministerial Buy a Cow! Thank you to those who have given towards purchasing a cow (meat) for the food bank. We have matched the \$1,000 and have collected additional funds to help meet the need. With your help and the generous donation of processing feeds, we will be able to supply York County residents with much needed meat this holiday season. You are still welcome to contribute to the project if you would like by writing out your checks to Henderson Ministerial Association and giving them to any of the pastors at Bethesda, FEBC or Living Hope.
- If you know of someone who may be in need of food, please contact one of the ministerial pastors. There is food available:

- Blue Valley, located at 3401 N. Lincoln Ave. in York, hosts a food pantry once a month, which participants will need to provide contact information to participate.
- Blue Valley also hosts the Feeding America Program Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:30-10 a.m. You may pick up bakery items, bread, eggs and many other items.
- The York Mission also provides a food basket once a month if you attend a chapel service. Contact the Hope Gospel Rescue Mission at 402-362-0127.
- The Henderson Ministerial will also be funding vouchers for Blue Valley to give out for milk at the Henderson Pharmacy. You may find them at Blue Valley in York.

December 2025 Newsletter

About a month ago, the employees who work at Swan Lake Christian Camp were all challenged to do a thirty day reading of the book of Mark. As a couple of these people are newer to faith in Jesus, this challenge included daily written responses to the readings. I love the book of Mark. It is a fast paced overview of the ministry of Jesus. I found myself striving each day to make a comment that would foster discussion and engage in a better understanding of this gospel. There were comments I made that, after I re-read them, it was like "wow" God is good and I am pretty clever also. Others made comments that revealed how their brains were engaging with the text and, as a group, we were learning together.

As we approached the Christmas season and the Easter account, though, for me, the purely academic engagement came to an abrupt halt. As I read the familiar account of Jesus entering Jerusalem, his anguish over the impending humiliation and torture, his death, and his resurrection, I found myself in awe. No longer was I looking for clever insights or new understandings. Words like awe and gratitude were all that I could write.

Christmas sets the stage for discipleship, growth in faith, fellowship with other believers, but ultimately it set the stage for God's redemption. This is all about YOU!! It is God's love for you. Jesus came to Bethlehem as a newborn human being so that we could be redeemed back into relationship with God. He did it for us. Babies are cute. I love my new grandson. But, I for one, don't ever want to go back to laying in a crib, being misunderstood and unable to communicate with those I love. I don't want to learn to walk again and let's not even talk about puberty. Becoming a child again is nothing that I aspire to do. The account of his death is even more difficult to fathom. To consider that the King of the universe would humble himself to that level just for me is almost too much. Almost. It is perfect. Jesus did it for me. He did it for you. He is love in flesh. As we continue to prepare for the celebration of Christmas, join me in remembering the whole story. It is not too late to read Mark's gospel. Delve into all that Jesus did for you and remember that he did it all for

you. Sometimes we get so involved in the festivities that we forget what we are celebrating. Jesus came as a child. He spent time with us teaching, loving, healing and calling us. He sent us with a mission to tell others. Then he died as the only acceptable sacrifice for the redemption of our souls. He rose on the third day demonstrating mastery over death and he goes to prepare a place for us.






