CELEBRATION OF LIFE

Adeline Ruth (Peters) Huebert, age 86 of Henderson, peacefully passed away to her heavenly home on Monday, October 20, 2025 in Henderson. She was born on November 7, 1938 to Arnold and Lenora (Friesen) Peters on a farm near Henderson. Adeline was the second born of six children. Her older brother was Wayne, and younger siblings were sister Arlyce, and brothers Maylon, Lowell, and Homer. She attended grade school at District 90 in York County from 1st-4th grade, and then 5th-8th grade at District 52 in Hamilton County. She graduated from Henderson High School in 1956 as valedictorian of her class. Adeline attended Bethel College for 1 year and then worked as a receptionist at the Henderson Clinic.

On October 3, 1958 she was united in marriage to John H. Huebert at Bethesda Mennonite Church by the Revered John Gaeddert. They were blessed with 67 years of marriage. To their union 3 children were born. Lynn Alan in 1960. Monica Sue in 1962 and Jerry Dee in 1965. They moved to their farm in the spring of 1959 and lived in the same house for 60 plus years. In 2021 they retired and moved to their condo in Henderson.

Adeline was baptized at Bethesda Mennonite Church in Henderson on May 29, 1955 by the Reverend Arnold Nickel. Adeline enjoyed singing in the church choir and other ensembles for many years. She taught both bible school and Sunday school and enjoyed serving on the Bethesda Stained Glass Windows Committee as well. She was an active member of the Women's Mission Circle and the Hospital Auxiliary. She enjoyed a service trip to Guatemala with her husband John. They also traveled to Paraguay 2 times and Germany once. John and Adeline hosted several MCC Voluntary Service workers in their home. One of her greatest joys was starting the school kit packing night at Bethesda which has continued for over 20 years. Also, for many years Adeline and John spent numerous hours volunteering at the Heritage Park. They both were recently nominated and selected for the 2025 Heritage Park Hometown Heros Award.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Arnold and Lenora Peters, brother Wayne Peters, son Lynn Huebert, and parents-in-law, along with several sister and brother in laws. She is survived by her husband John Huebert, daughter-in-law Melissa (Phil) Goertzen, daughter Monica (Parker) Hill and son Jerry (Pam) Huebert.
