CELEBRATION OF LIFE

Micheal Harrison passed away on May 31, 2026 at the age of 73. He was born on August 16, 1952 to Althea (Foote) and Robert Cornell in Omaha, NE. He was later at a very young age adopted by Stanley R. Harrison.

Micheal attended school in York, NE and graduated from York High School in 1970.

Upon graduation Micheal went into the U.S. Navy and attended basic training in San Diego, CA. During that time, he was later Honorably Medically discharged without having completed his full basic training.

Upon returning back to York Micheal went to work for the Nebraska Department of Roads Construction office in York. He worked there for two years before attending one year at Fairbury Jr. College and then returned to the Department of Roads.
