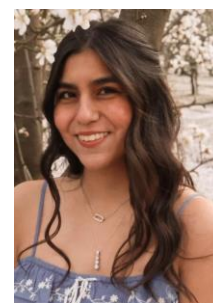

We were recently informed that the Kingsburg Healthcare District would not be renewing their grant for our Tutoring Center. We have 50 students currently attending, and we are seeing significant improvements in the vast majority of our students. Frankly, a small panic session ensued, followed by much prayer.

A few days later a couple walked through our doors telling us that they felt led to donate to KCAPS. After a conversation, a tour, and more prayer, they wrote a check that will entirely fund next year's Tutoring Center expenses.

DID YOU KNOW?

- KCAPS was incorporated in 1979 and is a non-denominational Christian outreach and a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Your donations to us are tax deductible.
- Our Thrift Store sales cover 100% of staff related expenses and 87% of our total administrative expenses such as property taxes, insurance, and utilities.
- Household items and clothing donated to KCAPS provide the goods for our Thrift Stores in Kingsburg, London, and Traver.
- In 2025 we spent \$290,805 on Emergency Services and Ministry Outreach. Of that \$126,052 was spent purchasing food. (This does not include the value of donated food items.)
- In 2025 KCAPS distributed enough food through our food bank to make approximately 39,685 meals
- In cooperation with the Central California Food Bank's Neighborhood Market, whose food offerings we supplemented, an additional approximate 15,660 meals were provided to primarily Traver and London families. These distributions are coordinated and staffed by KCAPS.
- That equals approximately 55,345 meals
