Experience Museum of the Bible

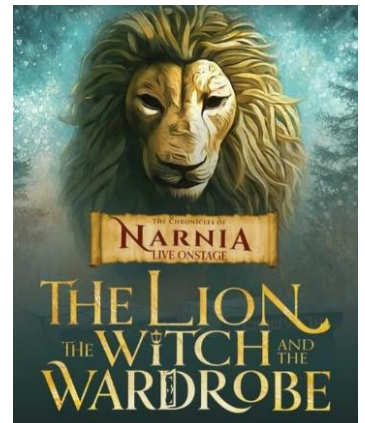
