From the Pastor

#### IT'S ALL A MATTER OF PERSPECTIVE

On our recent vacation out west (about which you will undoubtedly hear a great deal in the days ahead!), we had many interesting experiences. Having lived in New Mexico for a short time, I was accustomed to hearing transplants like me saying that, while it was beautiful, they missed the trees. Outside of the national forests, the trees there tended to be more like bushes and were scattered across rugged terrain. For those of us who commonly saw trees at every turn, it seemed less "green."

We encountered a shopkeeper, a Navaho gentlemen, who told us he had been in Washington, D.C., with his wife who was attending some women's ministry conference. We asked him about his experience, and he reported that he enjoyed it – except there were too many trees! Trees everywhere! On the corners! In the yards! Just outside buildings! Everywhere! He said he felt closed in and could hardly wait to get back to the open spaces of the West.

We laughed for days over that conversation. I guess it does matter what you get used to. In church, for example, we have our ideas of what makes us comfortable and what challenges our comfort. And there is nothing wrong with that. We all have our preferences, most of which are based primarily on experience. Others who may not share our comfort zones can still share our commitments to Christ and dedication to come to His table as a diverse family. That not only stretches us but it honors the Father who loves each and every one of His children.

Let us engage in debate over things that matter: Is God alive and well and working in Hopewell? Is there hope for His church in this area? Do people still need salvation and can they still trust God to save them? (The answer to all of those is a resounding "Yes!") I can look beyond the mountains and he can look beyond the trees to find the handiwork of a holy, mighty Creator God, who blesses us with such beauty that we gape in awe, even if we are uncomfortable.

So "Come, let us worship and bow down. Let us kneel before the Lord our God, our Maker. For He is our God and we are the people of His pasture and then sheep of His hand' (Psalm 96:4). It's not about the trees, is it?



## FBC "Spruce it Up" Project

Folks have been hard at work sprucing up FBC, and great steps have been made to make the church shine. Thanks to everyone who has pitched in to help! The areas cleaned so far are: vestibule, sanctuary, FLC entrance, and halls outside the Pastor's office and down by the parlor.

Automatic double doors as well as hanging light outside the doors where a bird had built a nest were cleaned.

Areas that still need to be targeted include the second floor educational wing, classrooms and areas behind baptistry, halls and steps and doors leading to Fellowship Hall, classrooms near and possibly in Fellowship Hall area, halls and steps leading down to gym, gym area, walls outside gym area, bathrooms near gym, and hallways and steps areas leading from gym up to FLC.

The next clean-up dates are scheduled for July  $16^{th}$  and July 17th, but cleaning can be done at any time. A list of areas that need "sprucing up"

can be found in the volunteer office or contact the church office if you'd like to help with the cleaning. For safety, please do not work alone in the building – find a partner. If cleaning is done outside of the group work days, please let the church office know or note the areas of clean-up on the bulletin board in the volunteer office/copy room.

## The Flamingos are Back!

Support the FBC Youth mission trip to New York with this fun fundraiser!

A small flock of 25 pink lawn flamingos has relocated to Hopewell. These birds are looking for nice, well-kept front yards as a temporary home.



How it Works:

If you would like to send these flamingos to "nest" in a friend or neighbor's yard for a day or two, simply fill out the form below and place it (along with payment) in the baskets located throughout the Church.

Our flamingo friends will appear in the designated yard one night (we will let you know when), and stay for about 24 -48 hours before moving on to their next nesting grounds. The house to which you have sent the birds will receive a note of thanks for hosting our guests and, unless you request to remain anonymous, acknowledgement of the sender.

First requests to send a flocking are \$20, subsequent requests are \$15 each.

If you would like to remain anonymous to your flockee, add \$5 to each request and put a star next to the person's name and address.

Insurance is available for purchase. Insurance prevents you from getting flocked and costs \$50. If someone attempts to flock an insured yard, they will have an option to flock someone else or a refund.
