PASTOR'S CORNER:

Ok, a little quiz of things related to the season from Dr. Martin Luther, who loved Christmas-

Can you think of Christmas traditions that are tied to Martin Luther (even though we are not sure about some of them)?

Gift-giving on Christmas Eve – Luther wanted to get away from the idea that "saints" brought our gifts (which happened on St. Nicholas' Day, Dec 6th) so he instituted giving gifts in his family on Christmas Eve and told the children they were from the "Christkind," the holy Christ-child. The timing caught on but although they still honor visits from the Christkind in Germany, the popular view of gifts reverted back to St. Nick.

Lighted Christmas trees – Luther walked home one night and saw the stars shing through the fir trees. It inspired the idea to put lights on the Christmas trees.

Luther composed hymns in the language of the people and encouraged congregational singing. Christmas favorites from him include "From Heaven Above to Earth I Come," (yes, with all of its 15 wonderful verses), "To Shepherds as The Watched by



Night," "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice," and "We Praise You Jesus at Your Birth."

Luther's Christmas Sermons are among his most compelling. Here is a segment from one...

I wouldn't have believed. If I'd been God and wanted to save the world, I wouldn't have done it that way. I would have just called in the devil and twisted his nose and said, "Let my people go!"

But God is amazing. He sends a little baby, as weak as an earthworm, lying in the feedbox of a donkey, and that little baby crunches the devil's back and overcomes all the power of Hell, and sin, and death.

Make this season all about Christ! Join in worship Christmas Eve at 6:00pm and Christmas Morning at 10:00am.

In the early church at Jerusalem, the Christians heard that there were new followers of Jesus among the Hellenists in Antioch, so they sent Barnabas there to minister to them. Christian congregations with a heart for Christ's great commission have always sought to "send" representatives into fertile fields of mission for the sake of the Gospel. One of the things for which I am filled with rejoicing is that Hope is a sending church. Over 10% of our budget goes outside of

the church for the work of the Gospel – and that amount is supplemented enormously by Brat sales, the Car Show, and special offerings which all go to the efforts of our fellow Christians somewhere around the world. Sola Deo Gloria!

In 2025, we supported Rev. Dr. Walt Steele and his wife Robyn as they transitioned from working with the Lutheran Seminary in Kenya, to the **Philippines**, where they will support the Lutheran Church there along with the Lutheran Seminary where Dr. Steele has been installed as a faculty member. He is teaching five classes and coordinating with church leaders on



how they can strengthen Lutheran churches across the region and plant new congregations. Robyn, whom Hope Lutheran Church also supported this year in her Deaconess studies at Concordia Ft Wayne, has been supporting the women's groups of the local churches. Less than a year after their arrival, they have already had an earthquake and several typhoons. Hope's proposed budget for 2026 would double our gift to them.

Hope received a thank you from "A Place of Refuge" in Milwaukee for our gift of \$500. They share Jesus and provide a loving and caring environment for women in crisis pregnancies or dangerous situations.

TIJUANA MISSION PROJECT JULY 26-AUG 2, 2025

This past summer, I had the privilege to serve our LORD and witness to families in Tijuana, Mexico by building three homes along with my brothers and sister in the faith from Immanuel Lutheran Church in Crystal Lake.

Under the guidance and watchful eyes of Karl Storz who organizes and coordinates every last detail with our local contact, Daniel Martinez. Karl arranges flights, reservations, meals, van rentals, and assigns all the volunteers to the various construction teams. This year we had three teams led by men with construction experience.

I was privileged to lead seven enthusiastic men, women, and teens in the construction of a home for our family, which consisted of husband, wife, three children, and grandmother. Every year the houses are built to a specific blueprint on a 12'x12' concrete slab prepared by Daniel before we arrive.

Each house has four walls of 2"x4" framing and $\frac{1}{2}$ "OSB painted and trimmed. The shed style roof is covered with waterproof material. By being higher at one end, the homes have a 4'x12' loft which typically serves as the sleeping area for the children. There are two windows and a door with a dead bolt lock. The interior is unfinished and there is no electricity or running water – but it safely protects the family from the elements.

The team flies to San Diego on Saturday, picks up groceries, and drives into Tijuana. Sunday, we attend church, visit the town, and prep materials for the week. On Monday, all team members get familiarization with tools and techniques and then visit the building sites. They complete the homes over Tue, Wed, and Thur. Friday morning, the homes are joyously dedicated and the keys are turned over to the families. That afternoon, they drive back to San Diego, have dinner together, and enjoyed a free day at La Jolla Shores on Saturday.

This was my third trip with Immanuel and every year, the enthusiasm and dedication of the people amazes and humbles me. Their witness to our LORD and Savior, and expressions of faith are constant reminders, both for the families who receive homes and for us, of the

strength in the Holy Spirit. The trip reminds me of our many blessings at home as well as an encouragement in faith for the families in Mexico.

OUTREACH Making Christ Known to Others

Spiritual conversations. For part of my career I worked in an office with about 600 employees, probably half engineers. There was a full time Doctor on site, Dr. Potts. She was a great Doctor and always had an engineer joke. One I remember is: How do you tell and extroverted engineer from and introverted engineer? The extroverted engineer looks at your shoes when they are talking to you. I think when it comes to spiritual conversations suddenly all of us become introverted engineers. How to start a conversation about Christ? How to continue the conversation? Just having a spiritual conversation with a stranger is uncomfortable. Talk about the Packers with friends or strangers— no problem. Share your faith and making Christ known to others? For many not so easy.

If you wear a Packers jersey, strangers you meet start talking about how great the Packers are. Conversations are easy. A few years back we had "How Can I Pray For You" T shirts for people working the Outreach table at the brat fry mission fundraiser. One of our members recently wore one of the T shirts to Menards. Checking out the clerk asked our member to pray for them. The member's T shirt both showed his faith in Christ and acted as a conversation starter for a spiritual conversation. The conversation became easy. There are many ways to start a spiritual conversation. This one was excellent. An engineer is about identifying a problem and providing solutions. Do you have a problem starting a spiritual conversation? Problem solved! Pastor will be holding a Bible study in March on Beginning a Spiritual Conversation. Good stuff. When the dates come out block your calendar in ink. We will also be having special events/training about the same time.

Outreach will be joining Women of Hope at the Trees on Parade cookie sale. Tabra suggested purchasing cookie boxes with Bible verses on them. Great idea, great spiritual conversation starter, and great way to reinforce what the Christmas season is all about. We will also have ornament crafts for the children and Bible tracts for adults. This year Pastor asked the Outreach Committee to help define which missions and missionaries Hope financially supports. The guidelines were: tithing and beyond, giving weighted towards Word and Sacrament over acts of mercy, doctrinal commitments (synod, district, RSO's, Lutheran, others), relationships (a history with Hope, Hope members involved, and some tie in such as missionaries we know). Based on feedback 2026 mission and missionary giving was tweaked from less international to more local. Several missions and ministries were added.

EVANGELISM



In October Paul Schneider and Peter Voigt were blessed to join a team from Brookfield Lutheran Church on a mission trip to Thailand. While there they worked closely with fellow Christians to paint, lay a concrete patio, and build walls for a new church building. They also led a breakout session for middle school children during the Ban Hmong Hope youth conference. The themes for the sessions were "God's love for us" and "sharing God's love with others". Ban Hmong Hope hostile is located in Chiang Mai. Children who live in the mountain villages and want to continue their education past the 5th grade public schooling can stay at the hostel. Children are transported to and from school each day. At the hostel children learn about Christianity, as well as many important life skills.
