PASTOR'S CORNER:

How many people tell you what to do?

If your life is anything like mine, your life is full of almost nothing else! The doctor wants me to take these medicines. The dietician says stop eating these foods. The dentist says floss more. The IRS says "send your quarterly estimated payments." The garage says "clean me." The dog says "feed me." The mechanic's postcard says "overdue for service." Microsoft wants me to update. A flood of emails each day have something that I really must read. Pull the weeds. Iron the shirt. Don't speed. Don't forget the appointment. Dawn is after me to . . . well I guess the point's been made.

And into your life of laws, demands, requirements, restrictions, expectations – there is the voice of your preacher – "come to church," "go to bible study," "help with this event," "get your priorities straight," etc.

There is one big difference, however. Along with the many divine rules which, ironically, <u>I am commanded</u> to tell you, I also tell you something, quite the opposite of a command, which you may not hear anywhere else. "I forgive your sins for Christ's sake." Your doctor cannot tell you that. Your psychologist has no authority to pronounce that. Your mom and dad may inform you but cannot officially as part of divine worship "tell" you. Certainly no one in the government has any business saying it. You can't buy it at a store or get it online. Your Pastor, however, is called specifically by God to speak that truth to you on God's own behalf.

Jesus said "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven;" and "whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." We call this the *Office of the Keys* because Jesus said "I will give you the



keys of the kingdom of heaven." It is as though the pastor unlocks the locked door of heaven with the key so that you may enter.

God has given this authority to His whole church, but in the public exercise of the church's duty, He has appointed certain men to perform this role. So your Pastor has this job, not because he is a better man in any way, nor because the church voted on him as if anyone whom they choose could do it, but because Christ selected him for this task. "He gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers."

How much should I charge you for this? What else in your life compares to this in value or will matter by any comparison a million

years from now? What is it worth to you? God forbid that I would do anything but give this free gift freely to all to whom Christ offers it - those who are sorry for their sin. Nevertheless, though it is absolutely and entirely free and without cost, regard it as the greatest treasure you have. At the moment in the Divine Service when the Pastor, pronouncing the Absolution, says "I forgive you all your sins," let it be to you as if the treasuries of the world were suddenly wired into your account. Let it be to you as though the doctor just told you "we don't know what happened, the cancer is entirely gone." Let it be to you as though your heart's beloved just said "I do." With all the people in your life who tell you what the requirements are, here you are told of what was done <u>for</u> you with no effort, no obligation, no price-to-pay on your part. In that declaration your birthright is heaven itself, and eternal and blissful unity with the one true God.

CELEBRATION OF OUR UKRAINIAN GUESTS

Last year, Hope supported the sponsorship of a family from Ukraine to come to the United States for two years and escape the perils of constant warfare. They are staying in our parsonage. We hope all of you have had a chance to meet and speak with this wonderful family, Vasyl, Iryna, Arsen, and Viktoriia. On **Sept 21**st, in place of our usual Sunday School time, they will give a presentation to tell us about their country followed by lunch with indigenous recipes that Iryna wished to make for us. We hope you will stay and get to know them better.

The "United for Ukraine" program under which they came to the U.S. is currently not processing requests for renewals. At this meeting, Pastor will explain the situation and you will be invited to contact your congressman to push for this program continuation so our family might remain here longer if they wish.
