





Youth Happenings

Please pray. That's a funny way to start any article, isn't it? Please pray. Pray for what, for who, and what exactly am I praying for?

In 1 Thessalonians 5:16&17 the Bible tells us to, "Be joyful always, pray continually, and to give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." How often do you think about God's will for your life? Another way to put it; why in the world are you here? Are we all really here just to pray as this scripture suggests? Many of you, including myself, have answered this question by breaking life down into little compartments. Perhaps you think about God's will for your life like this: Where do I go to college, where should I live, what should my career be, who should I marry, and what kind of house and car should I have? It's easy to over think what God's will is for us. Don't get me wrong, all those things I listed are important, even to God. But God said, "Keep it simple; my will for your life is to be joyful, to pray, and in all things give thanks!" That's it, that is literally God's will for you! Everything in life flows from these three things including your education, your future, your bank account, your career, and even your stuff.

When I complicate things and lose sight of God's will for my life, to be joyful, to pray, and to give thanks, my life becomes unbalanced. I lose focus of God's will for me, and my life begins to shift into these tiny compartments. So, I work too much chasing stuff, have very little joy, and my relationship with God and others begins to take a back seat. I begin to question my purpose in life, and I become discontented and ungrateful. Have you ever felt that way before? If you are unsure what your purpose is, what God's will for your life is, just remember 1 Thessalonians 5:16&17. God's will, his design from the start for us, is that our life be full of joy, prayer, and thanksgiving.

Think about it. In the garden, God designed Adam to need companionship, so God gave Adam, Eve, which gave Adam joy. Like many of us who have left our father and mother to cleave to our spouse, our wedding day was full of joy. We find joy in the relationships that God gives to us. Adam and Eve also walked and talked with God on a regular basis. You could say that their "prayer-life" was great! Because that's what prayer is, walking and talking with God on a regular basis. Adam and Eve had both joy and a good prayer life. What got Adam and Eve in trouble was not a slippery snake. It was their lack of thankfulness to God. God gave them everything they needed and more, but it wasn't enough. They wanted control. They wanted to call the shots. They wanted to be God. Adam and Eve were consumed by what they didn't have. They were discontented and

ungrateful about life. So, out of an ungrateful heart, Adam and Eve consumed what they thought would make them happy; to call the shots and to be their own god. That led to their downfall. I wish I could say I was nothing like Adam...but I am. What gets me into trouble is when I forget God's will for my life; to be full of joy because of the relationships I have with others and the relationship that I have with God through prayer. When I become ungrateful, I forget about the goodness of God and what he has given me. I consume the world's rotten fruit, becoming consumed by what I don't have. I take control of my life instead of letting God have control. I chase after material things thinking it will fill me up with joy, but it leaves me empty. I become my own god and stop talking to and walking with God. Is there any wonder why then I question, what's the point of life?

God, I pray that I will walk in your perfect will for my life. To be full of joy because of the people in my life. My desire is to walk and to talk to you every moment of every day by prayer. Help me to always tell you thanks for your abundant goodness to me. You have blessed me beyond measure! You are indeed a good, good Father, and for that, I will always be thankful. Amen!
