### A Sacred Longing

Long ago in the bustling city of 19th-century Hamburg, Germany, a Lutheran pastor named Johann Hinrich Wichern sat in his study thinking about how to help the children in his care count down the days until Christmas. His life's work was helping the poor, traveling throughout Germany teaching the Bible and establishing mission homes and schools for children. His mission school in Hamburg was named Rauchen Haus



("Rough House"), which he envisioned to be a loving family-style home for neglected and delinquent boys who would otherwise be living on the streets. Though Pastor Wichern prided himself as a man of patience, lately the excited boys had wearied him with the constant question: "How much longer until Christmas?"

So it was on a cold winter day in 1839 when Pastor Wichern came up with an idea to help the children mark the passage of time until Christmas. He converted a large wooden cartwheel into a festive

wreath, decorating it with 24 candles: four large candles to symbolize the four Sundays of Advent, along with 20 smaller red candles to mark the days in between. [The Christ candle came later in history.] He told the children that the four larger candles represented hope, peace, joy and love, and the smaller red ones represented the light of Christ which would increasingly dispel the room's darkness. Every day as the children saw another candle being lit, they witnessed tangible evidence of John 1:5: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

For the boys living in Rauchen Haus, the wooden "waiting wheel" was more than a visual countdown to Christmas Day, it was a picture of increasing hope in the darkness. A powerful imagery that the days of waiting were not infinite but would have an end; that the darkness would soon be overcome by the light and with that, the muchanticipated day of Christmas would arrive. Undoubtedly Pastor Wichern read from the Christmas story these words of hope from the prophet Isaiah:


"The people living in darkness have seen a great light; And on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned."

It isn't difficult to imagine how those young boys must have felt as they sat around the glowing wreath almost 200 years ago, watching the candlelight flicker on the walls and dance across one another's faces. The light from the wreath reminding them that God was with them and was mindful of them. The beautiful candles arranged on the repurposed wheel of a discarded cart reminded them that they too had a purpose. And the glowing candles represented a circle of light that pushed back the darkness and whispered that God had not forgotten them. And perhaps in the light of the Advent wreath their impatience for Christmas Day was somewhat lessened as they saw tangible evidence of God's love even in the bleakest of times.

Perhaps this is why the popularity of the Advent wreath continues to this day: it reminds us that God is present in the waiting. St. Augustine famously observed, "Lord, You have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in You." Advent embodies that sacred longing and restlessness, offering the assurance that Christ is coming, has come, and will come again. It whispers to every heart, "You are waiting ... and Someone is on the way." In the glow of the Advent candles and especially the Christ candle, we remember that our deepest longing can only find its answer in the One who created us.


