The Ironies of Christmas

While waiting in the checkout line yesterday in our local grocery store, I was eavesdropping on the conversation taking place between the cashier and customer in front of me. The cashier was lamenting the behavior of some prior misbehaving and impatient customers. While she scanned my groceries, I offered my cashier a little sympathy and said, "The hurriedness of the Christmas season is no excuse for



misbehavior." I told her thanks for her help and encouraged her to have a better day.

I think sometimes there are some ironies in the Christmas season in that through the radio and department/grocery store speakers heralding "Happy Holidays" and "Merry Christmas" that the reality of "happy" and "merry" aren't always complementary to the season. Sometimes a misbehaving shopper or maybe the host of stresses related to busyness of this season drains some of its joy. I hate to admit it, but when I worked in retailing, Christmas became my least favorite season of the year because for nearly all of December, I was rarely at home.

Often Christmas can be difficult because of division, strain or a maybe a loss experienced in a family and it is during this holiday season that the pain becomes magnified. But aren't these the things that Mary and Joseph experienced? Their willingness to say yes to God and take on the task of raising Jesus disrupted the rest of their lives together. Everybody including their relatives in the small town of Nazareth knew that Mary and Joseph had an illegitimate child named Jesus.

Other than Zechariah and Elizabeth, some wise men, a few shepherds and a couple of prophets, who would believe the true story? Those acquaintances were mostly out of the picture, and I would imagine nobody in Nazareth believed that the Messiah was in their midst. Mary and Joseph carried a degree of silent suffering that would only get worse years later for Mary as Simeon's prophetic words "A sword will pierce your soul" would become a reality at Calvary.

Why did they say yes to God's plan for their life and accept this irony of Christmas? I'm not sure, but I think the Apostle Peter gives some insight when an event takes place where everybody abandons Jesus after an awful sermon. Jesus then asks His disciples if they are also going to leave. Peter says, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God." Awesome answer!


Mary and Joseph called him Jesus, but they knew Him as Immanuel meaning "God with us" -- which was the truth that meant more than anything and easily overwhelmed the reality of their irony of Christmas. I believe that we all experience different troubling seasons in our life during Advent, but the question is if the reality of Jesus being "God with us" is what carries us through and overwhelms our ironies of Christmas.

BUILDING OUR FUTURE - UPDATE


In the building update provided last Sunday, we indicated that the renovation costs were significantly higher than originally expected. This last Monday the Leadership Team made some immediate decisions to reduce costs. Also, various team members are pursuing some additional cost reductions while other team members are investigating supplemental funding options. To start construction as soon as possible we are pursuing a two-phase option that would allow completion of the worship center and nursery/children's area first and then the fellowship hall area to follow. While we almost have enough funds to complete the entire renovation, it would deplete all our current financial resources of which we are trying to avoid. We are believing that by the time the renovation will be completed we will have the necessary funds in place to meet expenses. However, we are wanting to always do our best to be prepared for less-than-ideal circumstances. Your prayers on this are greatly appreciated.



A LIFE GROUP RESOLUTION FOR 2026


