Our Anchor in a Quaking World

Halfway across the world on the last day of September, a devastating 6.9 earthquake struck the island of Cebu, Philippines. 72 people died, 560 injured, and 20,000 people are currently displaced from their homes. It was the worst earthquake to strike Cebu in 12 years. My son Allen was on his third visit to the Philippines visiting his fiancée Francia and had flown back to the United States just two days before the earthquake



struck. Francia and her family have been in North Cebu all week purchasing kilos of rice and other supplies to distribute. She shared with me photos and videos of long lines of exhausted and weary survivors waiting for their bagged portions of rice, deep gratitude etched on their faces. They are grateful to have survived. Others were not so fortunate.

One such family struck by tragedy was Jane and Jeffrey Baquilta. Having had their home destroyed by a typhoon in 2013, they were

filled with hopeful relief when they moved into a home built for survivors of Super Typhoon Haiyan, one of the strongest typhoons ever recorded.

The New York Times relayed their story:

Jane Baquilta and her family lived in a house they thought would keep them safe from the natural disasters that frequently batter the Philippines. Instead, it became her grave.

"She was excited to move to that house because it was made of concrete, unlike our shanties here in the fields," Jeffrey said.

The 6.9-magnitude earthquake that struck Cebu on Tuesday night reduced that promise to rubble. It rendered several hospitals unusable, disrupted water and power lines and damaged bridges and government offices. Some died in landslides. Others were crushed by the structures meant to protect them.

Jane and two of their children perished in the earthquake. They thought they were safe, taking comfort in the concrete walls which actually proved to be the instruments of their death.

In life, we often operate with a false sense of security, believing ourselves to be insulated from sudden disaster or misfortune for myriad reasons. Jane believed her house to be strong enough to withstand a typhoon; it was instead devasted by an earthquake. We often believe we are insulated from sudden misfortune because we have financial resources, good jobs, solid health insurance, acumen and ingenuity, or other reasons. But no one is immune. I've always been struck by the somber truth of Ecclesiastes 9:12: "People can never predict when hard times might come. Like fish in a net or birds in a trap, people are caught by sudden tragedy."

In conversations with Francia, we talked about our hopes that the survivors will be drawn to God as they experience the tangible nature of God's provisions of rice.

"Yes," she replied. "Maybe it's also His way of showing people who no longer believe in Him to repent and come back to Him."

I thought of the words of CS Lewis: "God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our consciences, but shouts in our pains: It is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

God often uses tragedy to call us back to Him. And that is our message as Christians – repent and believe the Gospel. That is the message we must take to the ends of the earth. "Man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward," lamented Job in the midst of his own suffering. Nothing in this life can ever fully shield us from


sudden misfortune. Our sole place of refuge is and always will be Jesus and Jesus alone. Though sudden misfortune befall, we are everlastingly safe in Him.


