An Aramaic Tony Robbins

Last Sunday I split my message time to offer a tribute to Charlie Kirk and talk about his ministry, his love for Christ, and the impact of his death. I also focused on how several Christian leaders saw his death not just as an assassination but that he was martyred for his faith. While I have listened to Charlie Kirk's videos and podcasts occasionally in the past, I've found myself watching more of them since his death last Wednesday.



I mentioned last Sunday that Charlie obviously had more influence in our nation than I had realized. He in fact produced one video that had over a billion views, and it appears that this particular video may have doubled its viewing since his passing. That's incredible and rare among communicators.


I was watching one interview where Charlie was being questioned about his view of the popular version of Christianity in America and how it just isn't effective nor accurate. He stated that we are not clearly communicating that we are dead in our sins and in need of repentance. Instead of telling people that Jesus is on a rescue mission and clarifying what Jesus is rescuing us from, he suggested that the popular version of Jesus is something like an "Aramaic Tony Robbins."

Charlie was saying nothing against Tony Robbins who is the most popular motivational speaker in the world, but he was saying that some have reduced Jesus down to a person who simply can help us overcome any addiction and then make us more successful, prosperous and blessed in this life. Charlie stated it this way, "The Gospel becomes sweeter and your relationship with Christ is real and truer when you understand the stakes of the damnation that you were saved from."

In that interview, Charlie challenged churches who were communicating a "soft" version of Jesus that doesn't focus on the fact that we are sinners in need of salvation. We think that focusing on sin and the reality of hell is a negative emphasis until we realize that real love comes at a real cost. The rescue mission of Jesus involved experiencing the judgment of our sin which includes separation from God or the reality of hell. To deny the reality of hell is to attempt to remove the expression of Christ's love in redeeming us.

This has raised my awareness to be careful not to reduce Jesus down to an "Aramaic Tony Robbins" or something of that nature. It does raise a good question concerning the error of seeing ourselves and others in need of Jesus just because He can improve our lives versus looking deeper and seeing that we are truly dead in our sin without Him. I am reminded that Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life" -- not "life and resurrection." To me that seems to indicate that the awareness of Jesus saving us from our sins comes before experiencing the fullness of life in Christ.
