This special day – All Saints' Day – is a beautiful way to begin our month. We honor those Saints who have completed their holy and earthly journey in the past year. Those Saints include:

While All Saints' Day is technically on November 1, we will pay our tributes as with many churches on the first Sunday of November. We will honor these Saints with a special liturgy, a candle, and a ringing bell as we acknowledge them joining the church triumphant.

The tradition of celebrating All Saints' Day on the first Sunday of November can be traced back to the eighth century. A day to honor saints by the church with a special liturgy began as early as the second century.

In many Anglican churches, the day is typically to honor all of those saved through Christ and does not denote whether they were distinguished in life or death. In the Reformed Protestant tradition, All Saints' Day is a day to remember in thanksgiving to God for the faithfully departed.

If there is a day on the church calendar that I look forward to, it is All Saints' Day.

There is something miraculous about All Saints' Day. There is something allencompassing about All Saints' Day. There is something spiritual about All Saints' Day.

When we light candles, ring a bell, and read the names aloud of our loved ones, the Spirit hears our cries. The Spirit feels our broken hearts. The Spirit lifts us up. As we honor those who have died, we are grateful for their witness and humbled by their example. They have marked the path; it is up to us to follow the way.

These saints were not perfect, but they were forgiven. And they were saved by grace. As are we.

On this special day and every day throughout the year, we give thanks to God for those whom we have known and loved, who, by their patient obedience and self-denial, steadfast hope and helpfulness in trouble, have shown the same mind that was in Christ Jesus. As they have comforted and upheld our souls, grant us grace to follow in their steps, and at last to share with them in the inheritance of the saints in light; through Jesus Christ our Savior.

We also ask God to be with those still in their earthly pilgrimage. Give new life to your servants by the grace of baptism. Strengthen all who bear the sign of the cross. Clothe us in compassion and love. Bring us with all your saints to the river of life.


