Sometimes I have to laugh at myself when I think I am in control of my schedule, my routine, my plans, well ... basically my life. I like to have a schedule, a routine, and a plan. Over the last handful of years, I have let go of some of my desire to have things mapped out and just let events or situations happen. Maybe it's maturity, maybe it's age. It is probably maturity.

Even though I do not need to have a complete outline of what the day or week will resemble, I like organization. So, every Thursday I look at the next week and work through the tasks that must be completed. Those tasks many times include writing a sermon (because the congregation expects one every Sunday 😉), planning worship, planning Downtime in Devotion, pastoral care needs, and administrative requirements. I write down what I feel I can get done in the day. Sometimes I can work ahead. Sometimes I play catch-up.

I also work in downtime. This time is spent listening to God. My downtime may be spent by time in the study of Scripture. It may be a walk. It may be just quiet time in the stillness. It may be spent in prayer or quality in the Sanctuary at church. Whatever it looks like for the week, this special time keeps me going and is critical to my self-care.

Recently I was reading a devotional of mine that reminded me to relax and let God lead me through the day. I had to just stop and giggle because no matter how hard I wrestle with being organized or scheduled, my plan is always just my plan and not God's plan.

How often do you find yourself switching to God's plan from your plan? Or is your plan too rigorous that there is no time for God's plan? I have had days ... weeks even, in my life that I did not make any time for God or God's plan. I kept myself so distracted with professional demands or mothering needs that when God was calling ... I could not even take a message. So I adjusted my plan.

The most important aspect of my week ... I carve in time for the Holy Spirit's work. I do not know when the Holy Spirit will guide me or how long or labor-intensive that mission might be. When the Holy Spirit does call I want to give my full attention and not be bothered by thoughts of "oh I really should be doing this right now," or "I have to get this and this done yet today" or "the laundry is piling up and I need to get a load or two washed before I go to bed." The Holy Spirit made time for me and I absolutely want to make sure I make time for the Holy Spirit.

We are happy about our shopping experience with **Fresh Foods!** Along with our weekly items of eggs and gallon size
milk, we also bought 120 one pound packages of rice, 960 cans
of green beans, 20 cases of boxed macaroni and cheese dinner,
chicken noodle soup and tomato soup, a large amount of
cheddar cheese, and fresh loaves of bread in June!

We are still able to use the 'Gary's' or 'Fresh Foods' points that you so kindly donate, usually just on the milk but sometimes cheddar cheese! For example, the money we saved in June by using your points was about \$150. That helps a LOT and we appreciate your generosity very much!

Fresh Foods is following in Gary's tradition, donating heavy brown paper bags for us to use to bag our customers' groceries! For many years we had to buy paper bags from Cash Wa, but the quality was not what we needed and we would have to double bag, which just doubled the expense.

Our June delivery from the **Food Bank for the Heartland** will bring us ground beef, peanut butter, canned black beans, applesauce cups, flour, canned fruit, and frozen fish fillets for a total of 1,348 pounds.
