The Gospel selected for the second Sunday of August, Luke 12:32-40, was the same Gospel lesson of the second sermon I preached. I remember it so vividly and the innocence wrapped up in that message.

Climbing into the pulpit with sweaty palms and butterflies in my belly was overcome by my zest to preach the Good News! My naïve self was ready to preach that sermon! (I still get excited each week to preach a sermon.) That sermon, unbeknownst to me at the time, prepared me in many ways for life in ministry.

Building and maintaining a solid and everlasting relationship with Christ should be at the top of our daily chore list. Listening can be the hardest part, but in that quiet space, we can find all that we seek from God. In that quiet space, we can develop and grow the most loving relationship with Christ Jesus that enriches every facet of our lives.

As we ready ourselves, our children, grandchildren, neighbors, and friends for a new school year ... a fresh beginning ... are we readying ourselves? Whether we are starting a new school year or not, we are afforded a time to begin again each day. If you have not already, start building your relationship with Christ. I encourage you to find that time to speak to God and then devote equal time to listen.





# Would you like to be a part of the fresh leadership of Grace Ministries Food Pantry?

Tammy Miller and Leigh Henline are both ready to step away from the Pantry, after serving for many, MANY years. Since the pandemic, running the Pantry has been a completely different process than before, one we never could have imagined!

Where once over 90% of the food came from the Food Bank in Omaha at no cost, we currently must purchase the vast majority of our food locally, at retail prices with donated funds and funds from our savings account, which is shrinking.

Tammy and Leigh have focused on a healthful blend of milk, meat, eggs, canned vegetables, pasta or rice, bread, tuna, and peanut butter to give our customers. We hope that can continue.

We have a small but STELLAR group of dedicated volunteers in place, serving as customer aides, truck unloaders, sackers, and inventory control.

Our volunteers are the BEST!!!

Tammy does the ORDERING. She places weekly orders in person at Fresh Foods in North Platte and monthly orders online with the Food Bank in Omaha. She also spends time at the Pantry, seeing what needs to be ordered, and is available for questions that might come up.

Leigh does all of her work from home. She keeps track of all FINANCES, pays bills and updates two bank accounts. She keeps records of all DONATIONS and writes the thank you notes. She also writes this monthly article, and shares info with local churches about our Pantry. She prints all required forms, client cards, recipient sheets, local assistance cards, etc.

We desire Grace Ministries to continue as long as it can, as long as the donated funds last, to serve people in need in our area. Fresh new eyes might be able to think outside the box, write grants, and try new ordering options, both from the Food Bank and with local purchases. We are worn out, and have given the Pantry all we have to give.

Our jobs can be split into multiple jobs, if there is a team of folks that would like work together! Again, think outside the box! Tammy and Leigh WILL be here to train and assist! If no one comes forward, we will have to come up with a different plan for the Pantry, so...
