I don't remember many times when Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday hit on the same day. We know that Valentine's Day is the day of love, where we express love to those closest to us. Our spouses, children, parents, and the list goes on. It is a day to express love.

Ash Wednesday for many in the Christian tradition is the beginning of Lent, a season of 40 days excluding Sundays where we are on a journey of repentance, reflection, self-denial, and preparation for Easter. I think these are tied together in an unusual way. Valentine's Day, a day of loving people. Many times, in our society we tend to love things instead of people. What does the Bible say?

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love you neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27

If we claim to love, then we must from time to time examine our lives to see if we are giving it our all. We must examine ourselves to see if we have the proper objects of our love, or have we misplaced our attention and the object of our love.

Lent calls use to a season of self-examination as well. I hope you will join with me in considering a season of self-examination and listening to God to see and come to a new awareness of what growth opportunities he has for us this year.

Commit to loving God, commit to loving the way God loves, commit to loving the people God loves, commit to allowing God to love you and to take away the stain and the sin that is in your life.

A Note from Dana:

In his book "Your Father Loves You "author James Packer gives this insight into love:

The Greek word agape (love) seems to have been virtually a Christian invention -- a new word for a new thing (apart from about twenty occurrences in the Greek version of the Old Testament, it is almost non-existent before the New Testament). Agape draws its meaning directly from the revelation of God in Christ. It is not a form of natural affection, however, intense, but a supernatural fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22). It is a matter of will rather than feeling (for Christians must love even those they dislike -- Matt. 5:44-48). It is the basic element in Christ-likeness.

There certainly is something to be said about the familial love we feel toward our spouses or our children. But this Valentine's Day let's remember that true love exists when we love like Jesus does!

Since we won't have class Wednesday night due to Ash Wednesday service, I would like to tell you about a lesson from the kindness month that we won't get to cover. That week's key question is **How can you be kind to people you don't get along with?** There are times when we face people who we feel don't deserve our kindness. Most likely, preteens have a list of people who they don't get along with and why those people don't deserve their kindness. But Jesus tells us to love our enemies. Through this question, we hope kids start to discover how they can show kindness to people who fall into this category.

This week's class looks at **Matthew 5:43-48.** In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus expands the scope of who deserves our kindness. Not everyone will be kind to us; some may be quite mean to us. Jesus says that we should love our enemies and pray for them.

Bottom Line: **Be kind to people who aren't kind to you.** As kids discover what Jesus says about loving our enemies, we pray that your kids discover ways they can show God's love and kindness to people they might not get along with all of the time. They don't have to be best friends, but they can be kind.
