Hebrews 12: 2



Are you a fan or a follower? As we begin seeking to understand God's direction and purpose for our churches, it is important that we understand who we are as people who identify as Christians. Are we fans of Christ or followers of Christ? Are we theoretical Christians who present outward signs of faith but haven't felt the Spirit's stirring within us for quite some time?

Here is a little help to discern where you are at. Reflect on the past week and answer the following questions.

- 1. Did I live the past week as a disciple of Christ Jesus?
- 2. Did I seek Him with all my heart, soul and mind?
- 3. Did I encourage someone in their faith?
- 4. Did I victoriously resist a particular sin that is a stumbling block for me?
- 5. Was I humble/meek in all situations?
- 6. Pure in my heart and thoughts, blessing those that curse me, praying for those that hurt me?
- 7. Did I walk in peace, rather than fuel dissention or gossip?
- 8. Was I consciously open to the Holy Spirit's suggestions, and did I obey?

How did you do? Actually, that is not the correct question. The correct question is, "Do you want to do better?" In the Methodist tradition, wanting to do better is called, "Going on to perfection." Jesus described wanting to do better this way, "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23).

In February, March, and through Easter Sunday on March 31, our worship will focus on the question, "Are you a fan or a follower?" Although not necessary for worship, I would encourage you to pick up Kyle Idleman's book, "Not a Fan." It is available on Amazon for \$10.00. We are also going to offer a Lenten study on the topic. You will need Kyle's book for the study.

Both worship and the study are intended for everyone but have a specific focus for those who are already in the church and who identify themselves as Christians. We will seek to challenge ourselves and one another to take a closer look at our relationship with Christ, to deepen our relationship with Christ, to clarify God's purpose for our lives, and to draw closer to one another.

You will find more information about the Lenten study in this newsletter. I pray that you will consider joining me for worship and the study as we seek to love Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Think about it. Pray about it. I hope to see you in church.

Lenten Study: "Not a Fan"

A six-week small group Bible study

Doorstep News ~ February 2024

Each year has its challenges when it comes to providing basic needs services; often they are the same as the previous year. In 2023, we saw a sharp increase (88-90%) in the number of households and individuals needing food assistance. Our member congregations answered the call to help, donating an additional 11,608 pounds of food over 2022 for a total of 44,164 pounds of food. We received \$11,000 in Project Topeka funds to purchase food, but we also had to spend an additional \$54,632 out of pocket to keep enough food on the shelves to meet the need. In total, Doorstep provided 127,370 pounds of food to 2,307 households in 2023.

So far in 2023, we are not seeing a decrease in the need for food assistance in our community. And this year having a successful Souper Bowl Sunday weekend is even more important than in year's past. We have had many empty pallets in the basement where cases of food are stored. Help us fill those pallets and show your neighbors you care!

Souper Bowl Sunday is February 11th and we are asking our member congregations to collect soup and crackers that weekend again this year to help stock our food pantry! Watch for sales, and gather your donations! We can use all varieties of soup, big and small cans, and crackers. A successful Souper Bowl Sunday weekend can stock our pantry with these items into the spring months!

Our goal for 2024 is 5,000 pounds = 2.5 ton!

We set the same goal in 2023 and exceeded it by 3,000 pounds... Let's do it again!!





FOOD ROOM NEEDS: soup, crackers, spaghetti, spaghetti Sauce, spaghetti O's, cans of beans, all varieties, pork n beans, peanut Butter, can milk CLOTHING ROOM NEEDS: Sweatpants, male, female and kids all sizes; boys jeans, hats and gloves; girls jeans, all sizes; sheets and blankets, especially King and Queen but all sizes; hygiene: 2 in 1 shampoo, conditioner, bath soap, combs and brushes. CHRISTMAS ADOPTIONS: 278 households, 863 individuals received Christmas gifts. Thank you to everyone who donated items or money for this project. SOUPERBOWL SUNDAY: We will be collecting cans of soup and crackers to be donated to Doorstep each Sunday until February 11th. Julia Marsh will deliver all items collected on Monday, February 12. Doorstep goal: 5,000 pounds = 2,5 ton!

Doorstep will be closed on Monday, January 15th for Martin Luther King Day.

CRESTVIEW DONATIONS: During December, \$465 and 5 #s food. Crestview donations for 2023 =\$4,471.00 and 1,565.1 pounds of food. Thank you for all of your help.


