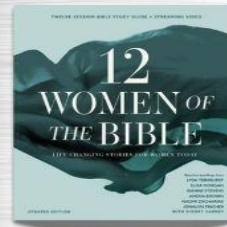


Director of Technical Arts

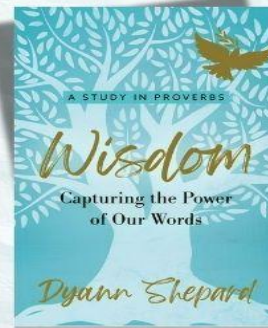

SERMON NOTES

Revelation 12:10 Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: “Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Messiah. For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down. 11 They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death.

Overcomers Stand in the Victory of Jesus (Rev. 12:10-11)

The battle is real, but Jesus has already won the decisive victory through His death and resurrection. Satan is called “the accuser” because he attacks with guilt, shame, fear, and condemnation. Jesus answers every accusation with grace and truth.

Romans 8:1 “There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.”

Too many believers still live defeated, even though Christ has already won the battle.

Practical Steps: Stop defining yourself by your worst failure.

Begin each day thanking Jesus for forgiveness.

Memorize Scripture that reminds you of your identity in Christ.

Refuse to replay accusations that Christ has already covered.

Discussion Question

What accusation or lie do people (or you) most commonly believe about themselves?

Overcomers Trust the Blood of the Lamb (Rev. 12:11)

Our victory is not based on our perfection, but on the sacrifice of Jesus. The blood of the Lamb represents mercy, forgiveness, redemption, and rescue. The cross is not only where we are forgiven. It is where we find strength to keep going.

1 John 1:7 “The blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin.”

Practical Steps: Confess sin honestly instead of hiding it.

Replace self-reliance with prayer.

When tempted, say out loud: “Jesus has already paid for me.”

Discussion Question

Why is it difficult for people (or you) to truly accept forgiveness?

Overcomers Share Their Testimony (Rev. 12:11b)

Your story matters. God uses ordinary people with honest stories to encourage others and point them to Jesus. A testimony is not about pretending life is perfect. It is about showing how faithful God has been through the struggle.

Mark 5:19 “Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you.”

Practical Steps: Share one way God has helped you recently.

Tell your family or friends how you came to faith.

Encourage someone who is struggling with a story of God’s faithfulness.

Write down your testimony so you can clearly share it.

Discussion Question

Who first shared faith in Jesus with you, and how did it impact your life?
