The Furniture Bank Tag Sale is almost here. We're going to need lots of STUFF, and we're going to need more HELP than ever organizing and selling it because we're not as young as we used to be! Please bring us stuff to sell, come help us organize it, then come on November 7 (6 to 8 pm) and 8 (8 am to 2 pm) to buy stuff to fill up the space you gained by getting rid of stuff. Please start cleaning out your basements and garages and attics, and save the good stuff for the sale. You'll get rid of stuff you don't need, somebody else will love it, and if you itemize, you can claim it on your tax return!

What we need...

Anything usually found at tag sales is welcome, but please note that it must be in good condition, and that we cannot accept items that are difficult to sell or dispose of, such as hazardous materials, paint, CRT (old style) TV sets, kitchen cabinets (yeah, we've gotten those!), large appliances (refrigerators, washing machines, etc.), tires, automobile batteries, or sets of encyclopedias.

Stuff to sell can be brought to the church beginning on Sunday, November 2, after the service. If you have stuff that you've just gotta get rid of before then (like you're moving to Arizona), give us a call at the furniture bank number (860 381-9224) and we'll see if we can arrange something.

Please note that we are no longer collecting used furniture for the Furniture Bank, and have very limited space for furniture at the tag sale. Furniture may be acceptable for the sale, but please **do not bring it to the sale** without checking with us first (can't stress this enough!). We may have to reject items that are too old, too large, in poor condition, or of limited utility.

We'll need lots of help!

It takes a whole week to set up and run the sale. It's a huge undertaking, but also a fun and rewarding way to reach out to the community. The more people who help out, the easier and more fun it becomes. Please consider joining us! We start setting up for the sale on November 2 right after church, and we'll need lots of help!

In case you didn't know:

The Furniture Bank, which began in 1982 as an outreach of St. Luke, gives new beds and cribs free of charge to people in financial need who are referred by social service agencies and churches. To date, we estimate that we have helped over 21,000 people. We have been running tag sales at St. Luke for 35 years (since 1990). The proceeds are used to supplement grant funds to purchase beds and cribs. Donations for the tag sale are tax-deductible. It's the most wonderful time of the year to give a special gift that keeps on giving. If you have ninety minutes or so to spare, you can do just that by becoming a donor at our next Red Cross Blood Drive on Thursday December 4 th from 1:30 – 6:30 PM. This special gift may turn out to be life-saving for a family member, friend or neighbor. In the true spirit of Christmas, you may end up helping a complete stranger, a brother or sister in need. One thing is certain; you will make a life changing difference in someone's life.

There are some things you can do to make the most of your time and have a successful experience donating. Schedule a convenient appointment time on the sign-up sheet in the narthex, online at RedCrossBlood.org. or scan the QR appointment code. Within hours of your appointment, please visit redcrossblood.org/rapid pass to read materials. When you check-in and have completed the short survey, your time will be recorded on your

name tag. Donors will be called in order of that time. It is likely that donors with early appointments will be processed more quickly than those with later appointments. There are 52 appointment slots available.

Meeting the requirements for adequate iron levels and passing the testing for infectious diseases can be a problem for potential donors. During the week before the drive, be sure to eat meals with iron rich foods and drink lots of water. Be sure to avoid fatty foods and alcoholic beverages. Pick-up a helpful fact sheet at the blood drive table, get a good night's sleep and drink an extra 16 ounces of water to experience a successful donation.

According to the Red Cross, every two seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood and more that 44,000 blood donations are needed every single day. The need is critical with many medical procedures delayed due to inadequate blood supplies. Contributions are essential in order to maintain a healthy and plentiful blood supply. The holidays bring a greater need than usual, due to increases in travel and corresponding increases in auto accidents, according to DMV statistics.

The Red Cross tells us the number one reason people give for becoming a blood donor is, "I want to help people. Here is an opportunity for you to help! Visit the Blood Drive table in the narthex following our worship services on Nov. 9, 16, 23 and 30. If you can't donate blood, volunteers are always needed to: prepare refreshments, set-up, register donors, staff the refreshment table, sanitize surfaces or clean-up after the blood drive. A volunteer sign-up list is also on the Blood Drive table in the narthex.

Please join us in making a special life-saving gift to the community at our Blood Drive on Thursday December 4th from 1:30 p.m.- 6:30 p.m. We encourage everyone who is able, especially healthy younger donors, to participate. Many of our older donors are no longer able to donate blood. We look forward to welcoming you at our next blood drive.

Treasurer's Report for September, 2025

St. Luke Lutheran Church Treasurer's Report for Month Ending September 30, 2025

October 9, 2025

Income Summary

Pledged offerings for the month of September were approximately \$7K below the monthly budget, resulting in pledged offerings for the year being approximately \$5.3K above the YTD budget. Grace Giving for the month of September was below the monthly budget by approximately \$1.2K, but generally consistent with previous months, except for the month of January, indicating that we were perhaps too optimistic with our annual budget for grace giving. With all offering sources combined, our YTD total offerings are approximately \$2.8K below the YTD budget.

Grins & Giggles income for the month of September was \$290 greater than the monthly budget, resulting in YTD Grins & Giggles income as of the end of September being approximately \$6.6K greater than the YTD budget.

We also earned \$427 in investment income in the month of September from our two Thrivent CD's.

With all budgeted income sources combined, our actual total budgeted income for the month of September was \$7330 less than the monthly budget, making the YTD total budgeted income approximately \$5.2K greater than the YTD budget.

In addition to budgeted income, there was also \$1526 of unbudgeted income in the month of September, primarily from \$1145 in donations to the Good Samaritan Fund, and several other small donations.

Total Budgeted YTD Expenses of \$373,671.66 is greater than the YTD budget of \$371,473.00 by \$2198.66 as of the end of September. September budgeted expenses were less than the monthly budget by \$923.07.

Treasurer's Report for September, 2025

Grins & Giggles YTD Expenses of \$65,398.41 is greater than the budget of \$64,109.00 by \$1298.41, mostly due to teacher salaries.




