

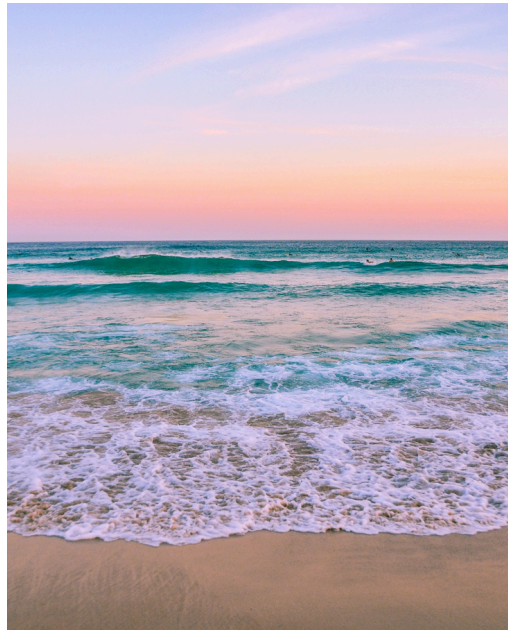

The Furniture Bank Tag Sale is almost here. We're going to need lots of STUFF, and we're going to need lots of HELP organizing and selling it. Please bring us stuff to sell, come help us organize it, then come on June 5 (6 to 8 pm) and 6 (8 am to 2 pm) to buy stuff to fill up the space you gained by getting rid of stuff.

What we need...

Anything usually found at tag sales is welcome, but please note that it must be in good condition, and that we cannot accept items that are difficult to sell or dispose of, such as hazardous materials, paint, CRT (old style) TV sets, kitchen cabinets (yeah, we've gotten those!), large appliances (refrigerators, washing machines, etc.), tires, automobile batteries, or sets of encyclopedias. Stuff to sell can be brought to the church beginning on Sunday, May 31, after the service. If you have stuff that you've just gotta get rid of before then (like you're moving to Wisconsin), give us a call at the furniture bank number (860 381-9224) and we'll see if we can arrange something. Please note that we are no longer collecting used furniture for the Furniture Bank, and have very limited space for furniture at the tag sale. Furniture may be acceptable for the sale, but please do not bring it to the sale without checking with us first (can't stress this enough!). We may have to reject items that are too old, too large, in poor condition, or of limited utility.

We'll need lots of help!

It takes a whole week to set up and run the sale, and to clean up the church after the sale. It's a huge undertaking, but also a fun and rewarding way to reach out to the community. The more people who help out, the easier and more fun it becomes. Please consider joining us! We start setting up for the sale on May 31 right after church, and we'll need lots of help!

Come and get it!

After the sale, we will have to load all remaining merchandise into a dumpster. We don't like to throw stuff away, so please consider coming and taking away anything you'd like, either for yourself or to take to local charities. We will begin promptly at 2:00 pm June 6.

In case you didn't know:

The Furniture Bank, which began in 1982 as an outreach of St. Luke, gives new beds and cribs free of charge to people in financial need who are referred by social service agencies and churches. To date, we estimate that we have helped over 21,000 people. We have been running tag sales at St. Luke for 36 years (since 1990). The proceeds are used to supplement grant funds to purchase beds and cribs. Donations for the tag sale are tax-deductible. Income Summary

Pledged offerings for the month of April were \$6.5K below the monthly budget, resulting in pledged offerings for the year being almost exactly equal to the YTD budget. Grace Giving for the month of April was almost exactly equal to the monthly budget, resulting in YTD grace giving being \$4.3K above the YTD budget. With all offering sources combined, our YTD total offerings are approximately \$4.7K above the YTD budget.

Grins & Giggles income for the month of April was above the monthly budget by \$1188, resulting in YTD Grins & Giggles income as of the end of April being \$2.6K greater than the YTD budget.

We also earned \$388 in investment income in the month of April, primarily from our two Thrivent CD's.

With all budgeted income sources combined, our actual total budgeted income for the month of April was \$9.3K less than the monthly budget, making the YTD total budgeted income \$7.4K greater than the YTD budget. There is a (\$3866) (i.e., negative) income for the month of April under "Special Income" in the Structures Income category; this is actually a \$3866 expense for (donation to) ELCA Good Gifts from the chicks collection. This was booked under Structures income since the last time this account was used, which is believed to be several to many years ago, this was used for sanctuary improvements.

Treasurer's Report for April 2026

In addition to budgeted income, there was also \$22,733 of unbudgeted income in the month of April. This included a \$1500 grant for Pr. Heidi's sabbatical from the New England Synod ELCA that was placed into the Sabbatical fund, a \$10,000 donation to the internship fund, a \$600 donation to the Good Samaritan fund, and multiple smaller donations and payments. There is also a \$10,000 Special Gifts Income in the Treasurer's report which comprises part of the total unbudgeted income for the month; however, this is not true income since it is just a transfer of the \$10,000 internship fund donation from the Church Windows donation module to the accounting module. There is a corresponding \$10,000 "expense" in the unbudgeted expenses. Since it is documented as both income and expense, it has no effect on the bottom-line delta between expense and income.

Expense Summary

Total Budgeted YTD Expenses of \$171,925.20 is less than the YTD budget of \$195,139.66 by \$23,214.46 as of the end of April. April budgeted expenses were less than the monthly budget by \$10,056.13.

Grins & Giggles YTD Expenses of \$30,040.54 is less than the budget of \$35,099.00 by \$5058.46.

Net Results: As of the end of April 2026 we have an Actual YTD Total Income of \$270,945.10, and Total Expenses of \$204,331.74, resulting in a difference of \$66,613.36. A high-level year to date summary is in the table below.
