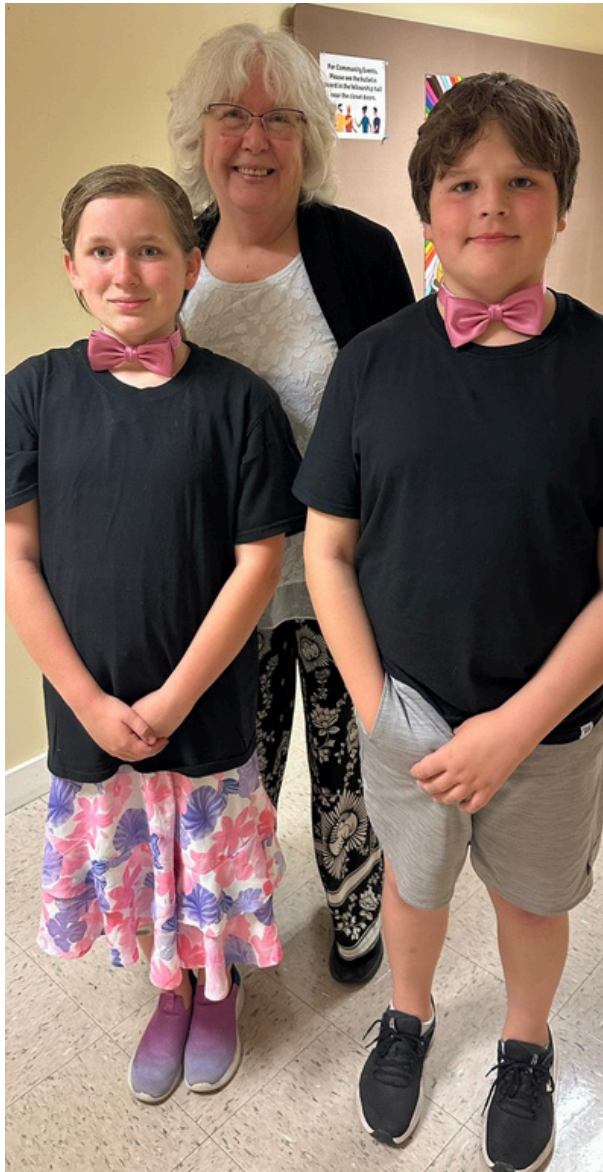

We had lots of help setting up and running the sale, and a very efficient cleanup crew on Saturday. We brought in and set up tables, clothing racks, and bookcases from our storage shed on Sunday, arranged and priced sale items Monday through Friday, held the sale Friday from 6 to 8 pm and Saturday from 8 to 2, and had the place cleaned up well ahead of the Saturday evening AA meeting..

Once again, our thanks to a team from the Thames Valley Council for Community Action (one of many agencies that refer people to the furniture bank), who took leftovers to Goodwill in a truck provided free of charge by U-Haul. In return for the donation, TVCCA receives vouchers that their clients can use at Goodwill stores. The New England Synod Assembly, June 4-6, 2026 was held at the DCU in Worcester Ma. St Luke representatives were Jacqueline Leone and Jim Sammons.

The overarching theme of social justice for all was evident in the workshops, direction of resolutions that were passed, and was in keeping with the values and traditions of the ELCA, the New England Synod, and St. Luke as we endeavor to do God's work in our community and beyond.

The following Resolutions were adopted:

- Resolution 26-01, World Council of Churches Ecumenical Decade of Climate Justice was modified and approved.
- Resolution 26-02, A call for boycotting companies complicit in Israel's genocide in Gaza and ongoing occupation of the West Bank and Gaza. (Background is available online)
 - Companies include Airbnb and [Booking.com](https://www.booking.com), Burger King, Pizza Hut and Papa John's, Chevron, Coca Cola, Dell, Hewlett-Packard, Intel, McDonald's, Re/Max, Siemens

This boycott is based on action previously taken to end Apartheid in South Africa.

We voted for Pastor Nathan Clements (Old Saybrook) as Dean of the Eastern Connecticut Rivers conference of the New England Synod.

A picnic and concert is in the planning stage to get the congregations together. Location and date will be provided.

Our support of our ELCA missionary in Jerusalem and the West Bank was discussed at a workshop. Bishop Haddad has been installed after Bishop Azar's retirement. Stories were shared about ways to support them amid the current rising violence and oppression.

Thrivent made a presentation on available money available and encouraged us to apply for more.

"Braver Angels" made a presentation and activity-based workshop supported by the NE Synod. Braver Angels makes available a studied, known, effective, and safe platform to communicate and gap from our polarized inner selves in regard to our political cultures. Inner polarization often puts roadblocks in the face of social justice efforts. This forum and program can be done through their online site and at in-person workshops in local areas and congregations as well.

The 2027 Synod assembly will take place on June 11 & 12, with Friday night worship at Trinity Lutheran Church in Worcester and Saturday's plenary at the DCU Center.

More information on the Synod assembly can be found at www.nelutherans.org looking under Synod assembly. This includes a streaming option for all three days. Workshops were not recorded.

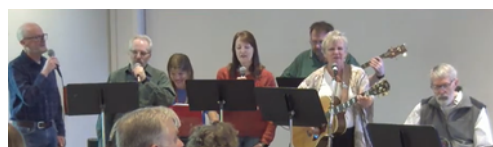

Income Summary

Pledged offerings for the month of May were \$3.9K above the monthly budget, resulting in pledged offerings for the year being \$4.5K above the YTD budget. Grace Giving for the month of May was \$770 below the monthly budget, resulting in YTD grace giving being \$3.6K above the YTD budget. With all offering sources combined, our YTD total offerings are approximately \$8.0K above the YTD budget.

Grins & Giggles income for the month of May was above the monthly budget by \$468, resulting in YTD Grins & Giggles income as of the end of May being \$3.1K greater than the YTD budget.

We also earned \$377 in investment income in the month of May, primarily from our two Thrivent CD's.

With all budgeted income sources combined, our actual total budgeted income for the month of May was \$3.6K greater than the monthly budget, making the YTD total budgeted income \$11.0K greater than the YTD budget.

A summary of the YTD May 2026 budgeted income is provided in the table below:

In addition to budgeted income, there was also \$3146 of unbudgeted income in the month of May. This included a \$1000 donation to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, a \$750 donation to the Good Samaritan Fund, \$500 in income to the Sabbatical Fund, \$425 in income from Scrip cards, and multiple smaller donations and payments.

Expense Summary

Total Budgeted YTD Expenses of \$217,495.57 is less than the YTD budget of \$223,394 by \$5898.03 as of the end of May. May budgeted expenses were greater than the monthly budget by \$5674.77.

Grins & Giggles YTD Expenses of \$39,072.14 is less than the YTD budget of \$43,930.00 by \$4857.86.

Net Results: As of the end of May 2026 we have an Actual YTD Total Income of \$320,409.00, and Total Expenses of \$253,543.16, resulting in a difference of \$66,865.84. A high-level year to date summary is in the table below.

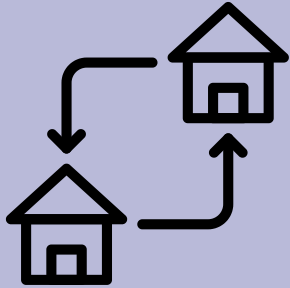

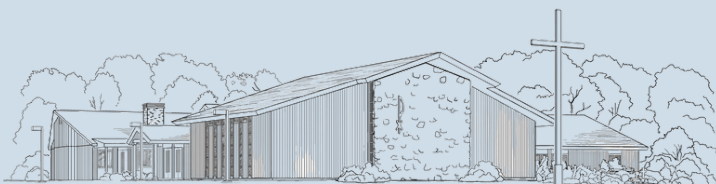
