I have been busy with a number of meetings through different groups this last month. The New England Synod scheduled another President Town Meeting and also invited Vice Presidents as well. These town meetings are with all the congregations that are part of the New England Synod. Scheduled meetings are going to happen each month with different topics that are being selected by the New England Synod.

Discussion for this last month was about Stewardship, Model Constitution, and Leadership Challenges and Opportunities. Casey Wilson who works at the Synod level was our host this

We learned that the Stewardship campaign this year is based off the theme "Rooted in God's Grace." There are a number of great resources that were discussed to let congregations know ideas that they can do their own campaign with. I really liked that they said:

"Stewardship is every day, every year and is all of your life."

Stewardship means taking care of the gifts!

We, the Executive Team, are looking into getting our Constitution approved with the New England Synod. We were shown a Model Constitution and will use this model in comparison to our own Constitution here at St. Luke Lutheran to make sure we are in compliance. Our Constitution will be given out prior to the Annual Meeting for the congregation to review and to be approved to send to the New England Synod.

There were small groups that we were put in, to discuss with other congregations of opportunities to bring in new members. One congregation is on the older side, so they are having difficulty in attracting new members. I did talk about how we just had a great celebration of new members coming to St. Luke Lutheran. We are still working together to bring in more members. One suggestion was to have short term projects to have more members involved and hopefully more to join us.

I am looking forward to what we here at St. Luke Lutheran can continue to grow in our ministries and our own faith journeys in the near future.

A mouse helping with the Furniture Bank Tag Sale? We'll believe that when we see it!. Meanwhile, we're going to need lots of stuff, and lots of help organizing and selling it. Karen and Mike are going to need more help than ever, since they're both using canes to get around.

We love tag sales, and we hope you do too! So please bring us stuff to sell, come help us organize it, then come to the tag sale on November 7 (6 to 8 pm) and 8 (8 am to 2 pm) to buy stuff to fill up the space you gained by getting rid of stuff. Please start cleaning out your basements and garages and attics, and save the good stuff for the sale. You'll get rid of stuff you don't need, somebody else will love it, and the money we earn selling it will provide beds and cribs for people who otherwise could not afford them!

Look for pictures of superheroes around the church (most of them bigger than this guy), and see how many you can identify.

### What we need...

Anything usually found at tag sales is welcome, but please note that it must be in good condition, and that we cannot accept items that are difficult to sell or dispose of, such as hazardous materials, paint, CRT (old style) TV sets, kitchen cabinets (yeah, we've gotten those!), large appliances (refrigerators, washing machines, etc.), tires, automobile batteries, or sets of encyclopedias. Stuff to sell can be brought to the church beginning on Sunday, November 2, after the service. If you have stuff that you've just gotta get rid of before then (like you're moving to Montana), give us a call at the furniture bank number (860 381–9224) and we'll see if we can arrange something.

Please note that we are no longer collecting used furniture for the Furniture Bank, and have very limited space for furniture at the tag sale. Furniture may be acceptable for the sale, but please **do not bring it to the sale** without checking with us first (can't stress this enough!). We may have to reject items that are too old, too large, in poor condition, or of limited utility. We'll need lots of help!

It takes a whole week to set up and run the sale. It's a huge undertaking, but also a fun and rewarding way to reach out to the community. The more people who help out, the easier and more fun it becomes. Please consider joining us! We start setting up for the sale on November 2 right after church, and we'll need lots of help!

### In case you didn't know:

The Furniture Bank, which began in 1982 as an outreach of St. Luke, gives new beds free of charge to people in financial need who are referred by social service agencies, hospitals, and churches. To date, we estimate that we have helped over 21,000 people. We have been running tag sales at St. Luke for 35 years (since 1990). The proceeds are used to supplement grant funds to purchase beds and cribs.



Several years ago, it was decided to change the traditional title of "Christian Education" to "Lifelong Learning", to better encompass the idea that we never stop learning about Christ, God's love, and our lives as Christians.

Kids' Corner meets the second and fourth Sundays of each month. All children are welcomed to join us and teen/adult help is always needed and appreciated!

Middle School Youth Group is looking for adults to coordinate and supervise events and activities for our 5th through 8th graders. Activities could include Halloween trunk or treat, bowling, corn maze, game night, movie night, and so on.

This fall, Adult Forum, includes a book group discussion of How to End Christian Nationalism by Amanda Tyler and led by Pastor Heidi. Beginning in the new year, we are looking for people to lead adult forum learning opportunities. This could be a single-session on a topic or experience you'd like to share or a multi-week discussion group.

Nursery attendants are still needed. This is a paid position that can be job shared.

Ministry News

THANK YOU to everyone who participated on September 7, 2025 at our God's Work Our Hands Free Veggies action. GWOH t-shirts, purchased with a Thrivent grant, were given out. We had abundance of produce from the community garden and from St. Luke members. Kids Corner had planted flowers in the spring, Leigh Sammons harvested and tied them into bouquets, and our Kids handed them out to our guests. Rain prevented us from setting up outside, so Diane Hansen – with the help of five of our guests! – brought the tables inside and wiped them down, then – again with the help of our guests! – stocked them with the donated produce. We had around thirty guests from 10:45 to noon. Elaine Remondi-Simpson brought lots of leftovers to the Gemma Moran Food Center in New London. We had nine WAVERS, who braved the rain and waved soggy signs on the edge of Route 12, getting honks and attention for our outreach effort. There are photos on the Outreach Team bulletin board.

# Sunday October 19, 2025 United Methodist Church Register from 12:30-1:00 p.m.

We will be gathering at UMC, on Chapman Lane, 12:30–1:00 p.m. with our neighboring churches in the community. After brief remarks at 1:00 p.m., we will be stepping off together to raise awareness and funds to help feed hungry people. Ninety-nine participants in the 2024 walk raised a total of \$20,292.00. Seventy- five percent of the funds, \$15,239.00, funded mainly global disaster relief. The Gemma Moran Food Center received \$5,073.00, 25% of those funds. Our 2025 community goal is to raise \$21,000.00 and continue to address increasing needs.

**What's changed since our last walk?** Church World Services, our faith based sponsor established 79 years ago, was among the organizations that lost all funding from the federal government. Four hundred employees lost their jobs and their mission has been curtailed. Locally food insecurity for our county has risen 15.1% overall and 18.9% for children. Gemma Moran is providing 6.3% more food for 26,849 people a month visiting pantries, an increase of 14%. Increasing costs and less aid cause more people to find themselves in need of assistance.

Why do communities across the country participate in this annual event? Our mission is to bring awareness to local communities about the ongoing need for all people to have access to: nutritious food, clean water, healthy communities and opportunities to earn a living throughout the world. We raise funds for: direct feeding programs; clean water and hygiene projects; provide people with seeds, tools, animals, and training to help them to provide for their own needs. (75% of funds are dispersed by Church World Services overseas, 25% stays in SECT)

### How can I help and join others in making a difference?

Share what you have learned with others in your circle. Encourage them to join you in donating funds for the mission. If you can't walk, make a donation to a walker on line, in cash, or by check payable to CWS/CROP. Join us in the ongoing fight to reduce hunger. We walk because they walk!

Other sung liturgy has come from outside sources, both composed by Marty Haugen – Creation Setting, and Now the Feast and Celebration.

This Far by Faith (An African American Resource for Worship) first published in 1999, is a new hymnal for us. More and more of our hymns have been recommended from this hymnal.

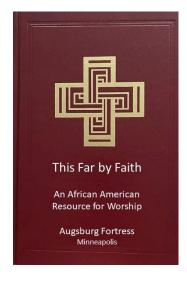

The interplay between worship and culture is often a messy enterprise. Fortunately, the Lutheran heritage calls for unity in the common, evangelical core of worship and at the same time allowing for flexibility and freedom in the ways this is communicated and celebrated.

# Treasurer's Report for August, 2025

St. Luke Lutheran Church Treasurer's Report for Month Ending August 31, 2025

September 14, 2025

#### **Income Summary**

Pledged offerings for the month of August were almost exactly equal to the monthly budget, resulting in pledged offerings for the year being approximately \$12K above the YTD budget. Grace Giving for the month of August was below the monthly budget by approximately \$800, but generally consistent with previous months, except for the month of January, indicating that we were perhaps too optimistic with our annual budget for grace giving. With all offering sources combined, our YTD total offerings are approximately \$5.2K above the YTD budget.

Grins & Giggles income for the month of August was \$540 less than the monthly budget, resulting in YTD Grins & Giggles income as of the end of August being \$6326 greater than the YTD budget.

We also earned \$296 in investment income in the month of August from our first Thrivent CD (opened in March). With the second Thrivent CD opened in August, our monthly interest/dividend income will increase for the remainder of the year.

With all budgeted income sources combined, our actual total budgeted income for the month of August was \$1190 less than the monthly budget, making the YTD total budgeted income approximately \$12.5K greater than the YTD budget.

In addition to budgeted income, there was also \$1342 of unbudgeted income in the month of August, primarily from \$1125 in donations to the Good Samaritan Fund, and several other small donations.

# Treasurer's Report for August, 2025

**Total Budgeted YTD Expenses** of \$339,440.73 is greater than the YTD budget of \$336,319.00 by \$3121.73 as of the end of August. August expenses were less than the monthly budget by \$4985.15.

**Grins & Giggles YTD Expenses** of \$58,885.39 is greater than the budget of \$57,515.00 by \$1370.39, mostly due to teacher salaries.

**Net Results:** As of the end of August 2025 we have an Actual YTD Total Income of \$429,719.50, and Total Expenses of \$364,812.28, resulting in a difference of \$64,907.22. A high-level year to date summary is in the tables below.

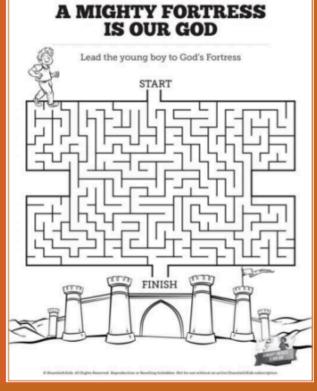

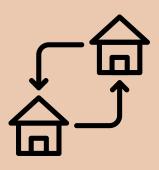

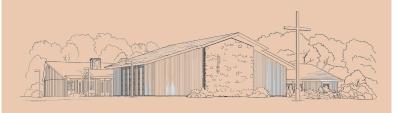
