Green Team Note: Our current Net Metering Credit "Bank" sits at 9.33 MWh—that's "Mega Watt Hours" of stored energy. That is equivalent to TWO average mid-winter month's electricity usage. We've still got two more months of peak generation to add in 2025!

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Stories are the heartbeat of our faith, friends.

The sacred stories of scripture expand our understanding of who God is and how God shows up in the world. The stories of our own lives are powerful reminders of how we have been shaped by the God of all creation and Christ's church.

I want to invite you into the story of St. John UCC, and into the vision to be the church God is calling us to be in our community and world, in Freeport and beyond, for today's healing and tomorrow's hope.

The inspiration for this year's campaign comes from the writing of the prophet Joel::

After that, I will pour out my spirit on all humankind. Your daughters and sons will prophesy, your elders will have prophetic dreams, and your young people will see visions.

Joel 2:24 (Inclusive Bible)

The stories we hear in worship bear witness to the ways we are *Dreaming God's Dream* together. The ministry we share here happens because of the ways you give—of your time and talents and of your financial resources.

Pastor and songwriter Rev. Bryan Sirchio wrote these words for a youth event back in 1991:

"Dream God's dream, Holy Spirit, help us dream
Of a world where there is justice and where everyone is free
To build and grow and love and to simply have enough
The world will change when we dream God's dream."

I can't tell you how many times I've sung this song, or lead groups in singing it. I can tell you: every time I hear it, I re-remember the joy that comes when we dream with God and each other how to be a more loving, just and caring world.





"I believe that our young ones begin life with innocent hearts...We artists were asked to imagine what a city of compassion would look like and how the people there could cooperate so that everyone would have enough food. *The Process of Life* shows that there is pride and hope in carrying out positive ways of thinking about things like this." *Adrian Sanchez, Artist*

For people of faith, what we give to God through the church is a reflection of our values. Likewise, how our church stewards its money is a reflection of who we believe God is calling us to be. Over the next couple of weeks, I invite your dreams and visions into our common space, our congregation. Our Stewardship and Development Team will ask each one of us to prayerfully and carefully discern their passions and priorities and decide how to align their resources of self, time, and money with those of our congregation.

This simple request bears our weighty prayers and an equally thoughtful response, as we each determine our investment in the ministry and mission of St. John UCC. The work of our church happens every year because of the generous financial and volunteer support of people like you and me. And this year, we trust that also will happen because of neighbors we have yet to meet. We're "That Church!" And our community knows and trusts that we will rise to each moment to which God calls our attention.

WHAT IS A FAITH PROMISE?


