Our Mission for Justice



National Native American Heritage Month is celebrated each year in November. It is a time to honor the traditions, languages, and stories of Native American and Alaska Native communities and ensure their rich histories and contributions continue to thrive with each passing generation.

This November and every month, we celebrate the culture and heritage of these remarkable Americans who deeply enrich the quality and character of our Nation. We celebrate the remarkable diversity of American Indian and Alaska Native cultures and peoples while remembering and honoring our veterans who have sacrificed so much to defend our Nation.

The community of St. John UCC honors that our church campus sits on the ancestral lands of the Sauk, Meswaki, Sioux, Myaamia and Ho Chunk. As a Racial Justice Congregation, we honor the rich traditions, heritage and culture that thrived here long before traders and homesteaders laid claim to shared land.

Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance on November 20. It was founded after the 1998 murder of Rita Hester in Allston, MA, by still-unknown assailants.

Transgender Day of Remembrance honors the memories of those who have lost their lives due to anti-transgender violence and hate. The loss of transgender and gender non-conforming community members' lives, including as a result of violence and hate, often goes unreported (or misreported) in the media.

As an Open and Affirming (ONA) and Racial Justice congregation, the community of St. John UCC honors their lives and legacies. We must remember that anti-transgender hate is inherently connected to other forces of oppression, including anti-Blackness and systemic racism, misogyny, classism, ableism, xenophobia, and others


CHICAGO AVENUE MISSION DINNER PROGRAM

DREAMING TOGETHER: 2026 ANNUAL GIVING CAMPAIGN

How we talk about our Generosity In Celebration, Mission, Outreach, and Partnership

We are a people of stories—and Biblically speaking, one story; the extravagant welcome and radical hospitality of Christ's Way. We tell the story of our budget and ministry goals this year with a Narrative Budget. Our goal is to more fully communicate the reasons behind the budgetthe ministries we seek to serve together.

But what is a "Narrative Budget?" A Narrative Budget is a way of talking about the future needs of the church to carry out its mission and ministry. Rather than simply presenting a spreadsheet style budget the Narrative Budget (as the name implies) tells a story. This year, our story "adds up" to a whole lot more than dollars and cents. Our story is one that changes lives and heals God's creation.

Our estimate for the 2026 budget is around \$468,000. Take a look how our narrative lives out our mission:

Sharing with Sense Beyond our Dollars: Our Local Mission Giving

For the last six years, the Mission & Outreach Leadership Team sought applicants for a grant-based support program. This method served us and our mission partners well before the COVID pandemic. Since 2023, our ability to raise the necessary funds, and our mission partners' needs, have changed. The M&O Team decided this year to suspend the grants, lowering their budget request by \$10,000.

What was their logic? We already give our local mission partners more than that amount in like-kind support! In measuring the real-life value of these collections, we share more than \$2,000 per month every month! Our collection carts are full with weekly supplies for FACC's Kreeger Memorial Food Pantry. Every month or so, a special collection is taken to augment the seasonal needs of our partners. This year, M&O will be tallying and valuing our gathered giving, and reporting it in the weekly bulletin and monthly Tidings.
