EPIPHANY, A SEASON OF STAR LIGHT

What are star words?

The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in Protestant churches for nearly a decade. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper stars. These paper stars are then placed in a large basket, ready to inspire each person into the season's continuing light. During our morning worship on Epiphany Sunday, January 11, everyone is invited to draw a word from the basket, and to use that word as a guiding word throughout the year.

How do Star Words work? That's up to you! Some folks place their star word somewhere they will see it regularly throughout the year. This can help you consistently reflect on how God is moving through, around, or in connection to your word. Others use them as bookmarks in their daily readings. (For example, Pastor Hank kept his in the pulpit, and was reminded every Sunday to "CREATE" something meaningful with God every week).

What words did you get last Epiphany? Did it help guide you in 2025? Or did it create a spiritual pause, as you sought its meaning through the year. If your word was a blessing, be blessed with its memory! If your word gave you pause, that's okay. Maybe its meaning isn't quite ready to be known. Sometimes, that's how God's still creating Spirit works.



So this year, let's prepare again to follow the Star Words again! Typically, participants are encouraged to trust the word they have drawn, and not to replace the word. However, there are no "star police." If you find that the first word you draw doesn't speak to you, place it back into the basket after worship, and draw anew, or find a friend with whom to trade words.

JANUARY - NAMIBIA

The United Congregational Church of Southern Africa (UCCSA) has had congregations in Namibia for many years, but it was only after independence in 1990 that the first North American UCC and Disciples mission coworkers were assigned to the country. Today, the Namibia Synod of the UCCSA understands poverty as the unequal distribution of resources that denies access to knowledge.



This results in people living under the poverty line, being burdened by debt, and suffering diseases. The Namibia Synod realizes that, as the Body of Christ, they must be the catalyst to change these trends. Through Christ's example, the Church is mandated to take up the challenge of addressing the unequal distribution of resources within Namibia. In partnership with Global Ministries, the Namibia Synod accepts this challenge through education, youth programs, ministerial training, leadership development, and advocating transformative justice and social responsibility.

MLK NATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE 1/19/2026

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. devoted his life to equality, social justice, economic advancement, and opportunity for all. He challenged us to build a more perfect union and taught us that everyone has a role to play in making America what it ought to be.

By making service part of our daily lives, we can help realize Dr. King's dream. Together, we can create and sustain opportunities for Americans to strengthen their own and other's economic opportunity, ensure that more young people graduate from high school, support our military families and veterans, and help communities prepare for and recover from disasters. Together, we demonstrate what it means to be citizens.

Thirty years ago, Congress designated the holiday as a national day of service and charged the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) with leading this effort. Taking place each third Monday in January, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service is the only federal holiday observed as a national day of service — *a "day on, not a day off."* This day of service empowers individuals, strengthens communities, bridges barriers, addresses social problems, and moves us closer to Dr. King's vision of a "Beloved Community."
