So they talked together and went inside where many others were assembled. Peter told them: "You know it against our laws for a Jewish man to enter a Gentile home like this, or to associate with them. But God has shown me that I should no longer think of anyone as impure or unclean."	"Then Peter replied; "I see very clearly that God shows no favoritism. In every nation he accepts those who fear him and do what is right."
