



### **Lenten Practices**

For nearly two thousand years the 40-day season of Lent has been used by God's people to remember the events of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Christians throughout the ages have chosen to take on disciplines to keep them centered on God all the way to Easter. We encourage you to take on these daily spiritual practices as well, which can help protect from distraction and increase our ability to hear from God. May we all be transformed as we participate in these exercises of grace.

#### Monday: Make no purchases

Most of us can buy things whenever we need them. Take a day to fast purchases.

Examples: Make your lunch instead of buying it. Plan to fill your tank of gas on another day. Avoid the vending machine. As you do, pray for those who go without.

#### Tuesday: Make a personal contact

Our lives can be so busy. Many of us are in such a rush that we don't have time for relationships. Examples: Write and send a hand-written note. Make a phone call to an old friend. Have people over for a meal. As you do, encourage them in the Lord or thank them for their influence in your life.

#### Wednesday: Fast noise

For many of us, we are constantly barraged with noise from our T.V. radio, or iPod. Our lives are also bombarded with distractions through social media and advertisement. Embrace silence so that God's voice may be loud in your life.

Examples: Turn off your car radio. Take a break from social media. Keep the television off today. As you do, sing a worship song, or speak out your prayers, and listen for God's still small voice.

#### Thursday: Add an extra hour of sleep

We are designed to need sleep. Rest is one of the greatest gifts God gives us. Some of us are exhausted from burning the candle at both ends. Be thankful for God's goodness by going to bed an hour early. If you can't sleep, lie in bed and read the scriptures or pray for the needs of others.

#### Friday: Fast a food of your choice


It is easy to become addicted to sweets, caffeine, and constant eating. Recognize your dependence on God, and be thankful for the things you enjoy by choosing to fast a meal or a food of choice. As you do, focus on your dependence on God for your most basic needs.

#### Saturday: Add an hour of physical activity

When we take care of our bodies we take care of the temple of the Holy Spirit. Examples: Go for a walk. Visit the Family Life Center. Swim a few laps at the YMCA. As you do, pray for those who are suffering from disease or sickness, and thank God for the oift of life and the health you have.

Sunday: Celebrate in worship! Participate with the community at the 8:30 or 10:30 worship service.

#### Dear Parish,

Calendars. Time. These two things govern our lives. As Steve Jobs said, "My favorite things in life don't cost any money. It's really clear that the most precious resource we all have is time." Our Lord and Savior teaches us in Matthew's gospel "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." 



#### **Executive Summary, Luther Point Bible Camp 2023**

2023 saw the 74th year we help Summer Camp at Luther Point Bible Camp. Our theme was "Walking with Jesus" and the

campers explored some of the physical areas Jesus walked in his ministry along with what it means to walk with Jesus in our every-day lives! We saw our summer camper numbers increase for the first time in a couple of years as well! 2023 also marked the second year we held the "Camp Connect" program where we held an on-site day camp program at Luther Point.

We were also blessed to work with Camp Breakaway again this year for the second time. Breakaway brings up to Luther Point over 80 young people who are or have been affected by cancer and provides a safe and fun place for them to just be kids! We are looking forward to many more years of partnership with Camp Breakaway.

We also held our annual winter camps for students in grades 6-12 in February. These youth come to us from some local churches and spend a weekend engaging in great discussion, playing games, and growing together!

#### Retreats

We saw a large increase in our Retreat reservations in 2023 with bookings up almost 25% from the previous year. Our retreat ministry continues to be a valuable resource for Luther Point Bible Camp as we are able to provide a sanctuary set aside for people to relax, renew and experience God.

#### **Facilities**

Winter was tough on Luther Point Bible Camp. With the windstorms and the excessive (to put it lightly) snow we got we did have several of our buildings sustain damage. Mostly to the siding and the roofs. We worked with the insurance company along with contractors and have made the necessary repairs.




