



### Pastor Message-May 2023

Alleluia! Christ is risen! + He is risen indeed, Alleluia!!

Holy Week and Easter Sunday were absolutely marvelous! The earth shook in our parish as we sang praises to God. Streamers and confetti bombs; flags out front to draw attention;\* opened tombs with butterflies flying out; choirs from both churches; flowers galore; heavenly sanctuaries; kids and youth helping in every service, and both churches served superb breakfasts. Frederic and Siren have heard our Easter Proclamation and between the two churches around 200 people came to worship the Resurrected Lord!


Yet within our celebrations we have had some dark moments—Clarence Johnson's untimely death, my sister's car accident, more-than-usual hospitalizations, and Brianna Dahlberg's (8) death. In her funeral I will have the congregation say "Alleluia! Chris is risen!" and explain the significance of having Brianna's Celebration of Life in Easter. How can we say "Alleluia!" when we are mourning? I worry about the perception non-church goers will have---are we being irreverent or making light of the situation? Are we just covering the tragedy with a band-aid to make people feel better? Of course, you and other faithful members understand the beauty of pairing Easter with a funeral---that is why funerals often have Easter/baptismal themes. You know that when we say "Alleluia!", perhaps even especially in the face of death, we are saying that God has conquered death and made us co-inheritors with Jesus. We know we will be reunited in Paradise with all the saints. For this reason, I am encouraging the family to think about this hymn we will sing on Easter 4:

- 1 The strife is o'er, the battle done; the victory of life is won; the song of triumph has begun. Alleluia!
- 2 The powers of death have done their worst, but Christ their legions has dispersed. Let shouts of holy joy outburst. Alleluia!
- 3 The three sad days are quickly sped; he rises glorious from the dead. All glory to our risen Head. Alleluia!

God bless you all and have a happy, happy Easter! Rejoice and sing, for Christ is risen indeed!

\*Easter is the biggest holiday in the Christian calendar. Then why does Christmas seem to get all the glory? I have been thinking of Christmas equivalents for Easter: flags where the nativity was; flowers/trees where Christmas trees were (witnessing the transformation of the Cross from dying, ugly tree to The Tree of Life!). If you have any ideas for next year, please share.





The PLC Women Mission in Action needs your help to provide items for those less fortunate than us. We

are inviting you to help us collect materials to put together three types of Lutheran World Relief kits: Personal Care Kits, School Kits, and Baby Care Kits. During May and June, we will collect materials for School Kits (list of materials below). Make this a family project and place your materials in the container at the back of the church.

**SCHOOL KITS** For children whose lives have been disrupted by war or other disasters. Receiving a school kit is a sign that someone far away cares. Adults in literacy classes appreciate the supplies needed to learn to read and write.

Include the following items in each school kit:

- 4 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approx. 8"x10-1/2", no loose-leaf paper
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- One eraser approximately 2½" long
- 5 ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approx. 14"x17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks); recommended fabrics include heavy cotton, canvas, denim, and twill. Do not add other items that are not listed. All items should be new and in good condition.



We had a total of 599 families.



### AND SO THE WORK BEGINS - REVIEW OF STANDING COMMITTEES MEETING

Did you know that Pilgrim has a church constitution, bylaws and continuing resolutions that are the foundation of what we do and how we do it? The documents are being reviewed in 2023, and we decided to focus first on the seven

standing committees listed in our church directory – groups such as Worship & Music and Christian Education & Youth that select worship hymns, set communion practices, or choose confirmation curriculum. Council members and interested church members met April 15 to begin to look at each committee's current status and duties in comparison to the existing bylaws. The goal is to develop functional committees that will be responsible for a range of ongoing and projected services that support the mission of Pilgrim Lutheran Church.

The meeting asked for comments to a series of questions, and we had a lively discussion. What would YOUR answers be to the following questions?

- 1. IF PILGRIM HAS A LARGE BANNER OUTSIDE THE CHURCH, WHAT SHOULD THE BANNER SAY?
- 2. WHAT ARE WE GOOD AT?
- 3. WHAT DO WE NEED TO WORK AT?
- 4. WHOM ARE WE CURRENTLY SERVING WELL?
- 5. WHOM DO WE NEED TO SERVE BETTER?

The information was gathered and will be discussed at the May 15 council meeting and a course of action will be set for reviewing each committee by those Pilgrim members who are interested. This process will stretch over the summer, but we are committed to getting it done.

The meeting ended with Pastor Emily's statement: "We have everything we need. Our God is not a small god." This should be our mantra going forward!


