Pastor Message September 2023

"Where Does She Retreat?" -- The Society of the Holy Trinity

I am part of an order, a more modern word may be ministerium, but it is more monastic than it is bureaucratic. I don't



really proclaim it much, because there are negative attachments to it that are not entirely just. Because The Society is the most pan-Lutheran organization in the land (Europe has their own versions of these orders but with deeper roots)—LCMS, LCMC, NALC, ELCA, WELS, ELS are just a handful of the more than 10 Lutheran denominations in the country—the Society is labeled as "conservative" or "rebel-rousing". Most of The Society is made up of pastors from the ELCA and NALC with some LCMS. The latter two church bodies lead many to those inaccurate conclusions.

In the early years of the formation of the ELCA radical changes were introduced such as changing the baptismal formula from "in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" to "in the name of (fill your adjectives for God here—often something like "Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier"). This may seem arbitrary, but it really is a big deal. Luckily, the ELCA never officially endorsed such things though it has underscored the congregational governance over and above the episcopal (or catholic, or church-wide) meaning that churches can ultimately do what they like. As a result, The Society was created:

"Ordained to the Ministry of the Word and Sacrament in Christ's Church, called to such an office in Lutheran churches, we form together an ordered society of pastors. We commit ourselves to gather regularly for hearing the Word, celebrating the Lord's Supper, prayer, and theological reflection. We gather to help one another be faithful to the promises spoken when we were ordained." --Official statement from The Society's *Rule* (www.societyholytrinity.org/therule)

Each member of the society signs The Rule. The Rule are guidelines for helping members of the society be faithful to the vows they made when they were ordained to the priesthood. I encourage you to read it. Never has The Society made political stances or propose schism or animosity toward the Lutheran church bodies in America. It really is a brethrenhood or support group for Lutheran pastors as we all navigate through the storm of religious changes and challenges. Being part of the STS has been incredibly helpful and I won't deny it. Labels like "liberal" or "conservative" are helpful only to a point; eventually it tears up traditions that are more complex than that dualistic thinking.

This is where I go when I am on "retreat". The General Chapter Retreat happens every September and is typically held in Mundelein, IL—basically Chicago. I am part of the Minnesota Chapter and we aim to meet quarterly for 24 hours of prayer, fellowship, theological study, and rest.
